



Yankees Nip Tigers With 3 Runs In 9th; Boston Gets Eighth Win In Nine Starts

(By the Canadian Press) The New York Yankees protected their American League lead over their persistent challengers—Chicago and Cleveland—Thursday but were forced to come up with a three-run ninth inning to nip the Detroit Tigers 3-2.

Chicago remained two games behind the Yanks in second place as the White Sox defeated Baltimore 8-0 and third place Cleveland stayed three games back by beating Washington 8-5.

Boston's onsurging Red Sox won their eighth in the last nine starts, coming from behind to nip Kansas City 7-6.

Virgil Trucks tossed his second straight shutout by shutting the Orioles as the White Sox made it six out of seven. George Kell knocked in three runs on three hits as Chicago rocked loser Duane Pillette and Joe Coleman for 15 safeties.

In the National League, Chicago's second place Cubs salvaged the finale of the three-game set from New York with a 2-1 triumph over the Giants. The Cubs had lost five of their last six, exactly opposite the record of the Giants.

Murry Dickson, veteran Philadelphia righthander, hurled a fourth shutout as the Phils blanked the Milwaukee Braves 3-0 to retain their hold on fifth place.

The league leading Dodgers were scheduled to play in Cincinnati and the Pittsburgh Pirates in St. Louis, both at night.

Blanked through eight innings by Frank Lary, rookie Detroit righthander, the Yankees pounded across three runs in the ninth to turn defeat into victory. Lary got the first out, then issued a pass to Mickey Mantle. Yogi Berra followed with his 12th home run of the season to tie the score at 2-2.

Irv Noren singled and eventually scored the winning run when Lary hit Eddie Robinson with a pitch. Joe Collins walked and pinch hitter Elston Howard came through with a single.

FANNED NINE Tommy Byrne, who fanned nine and permitted only four hits, went to the mound for the Yankees.

Larry Doby and Bobby Avila, each with three hits, paced the Indians to victory as Bob Lemon gained his ninth triumph. Mike Garcia relieved him in the ninth. Chuck Stobbs was tagged with his seventh loss.

The Red Sox, trailing 6-2 after seven innings, came up with three runs in the eighth on Jackie Jensen's two-run homer and another four-bagger by Norm Zauchin to tie the score at 6-6.

TOMMY BOLT Takes Lead In U. S. Golf Open

By WILL GRIMSLEY Associated Press Staff Writer SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Tommy Bolt, a fiery Texan with a putter that is said to be worth \$50,000, led in the 55th United States Open golf championship Thursday with a brilliant 67—the only player in the select field of 162 able to crack par.

The 37-year-old Houston professional, a one-time carpenter, one-outted 12 greens from 20 to 3 feet to cut three strokes from par and tie the second-lowest first-day score ever recorded in this blue-ribbon event.

Par for the Olympic Club's lake-side course, a heavily-treed 6,700-yard layout just off the Pacific coast, is 35-38-70.

Bolt's 33-32 gave him a three-stroke advantage over his nearest challenger, Walker Inman, Jr., a little-known, 25-year-old professional from Augusta, Ga., whose shots rent down the cypress canyons for an even par-70.

In third place came Jackie Burke Jr., son of a late Houston professional, with 71, followed by Ben Hogan, the four-time winner, who squeezed home with a 72.

Tied at 73 were Mike Souchak, former Duke football player, and Babe Richardson of Westfield, N.J., an alternate who got a last-minute ticket to the tournament. Other scores ranged as high as 96 by the host pro Johnny Battlin.

STUTT GART, Germany, (Reuters)—Daimler-Benz, manufacturer of the world-beating Mercedes racing car which caused the deaths of 82 persons Saturday at the 24-hour Le Mans endurance race, Wednesday announced its withdrawal from Grand Prix racing in 1956.

Mercedes managing director Dr. Fritz Koeneke also told a press conference at the factory here that the firm would not compete at any track this year unless its own stringent regulations were complied with.

The conditions, which the company laid down earlier this week in a telegram to the International Automobile Federation, included lighter security measures to protect spectators and strict tests for drivers.
