

Big Aluminum Plant Planned

WELLINGTON, N.Z. (CP) — A subsidiary of Aluminum Ltd. of Canada will build a \$5,200,000 aluminum fabricating plant in New Zealand, it was announced Tuesday.

It will be put up by Northern Aluminum Co., an English subsidiary of the Canadian company. A site has not been chosen.

Aluminum from Canada will be used to supply the plant's initial capacity of 5,000 tons of sheet and metal and 2,000 tons of wire and cable yearly.

The project will save New Zealand large outlays in foreign currency payments, said Philip Hurlway, minister of industries and commerce, because aluminum products now are imported.

(Continued from Page 3) old. The quantity of grain fed the ewes should be increased a week after lambing. Lambs will make rapid gains if the ewes are milking well. However, a heavy milking ewe may produce more than one lamb can take. In such cases the grain ration should be reduced, otherwise udder trouble may result.

As a general rule lambs can utilize grain to advantage upon reaching 3 weeks of age. This should be placed in a trough in a creep accessible to the lambs, but not to the ewes.

As the season progresses, the entire flock should be turned to pasture after having been treated for internal parasites. If external parasites are in evidence, it is advisable to dip all sheep and lambs about a week or ten days after the ewes have been shorn.
