

P.E.I. Per Capita Grant Said Highest

The provincial government is leaving itself wide open, according to Opposition Leader A.W. Matheson, "by saying that the province should have had at least gotten a per capita share, comparable to other Eastern provinces at the federal-provincial fiscal conference."

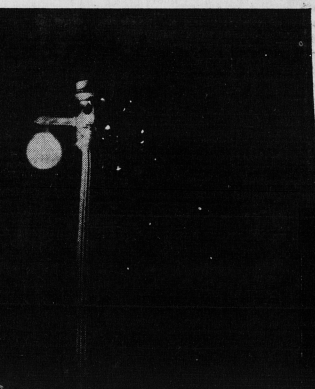
