Local and Other Items

CURE FOR CONSUMPTION—Some of the Italian newspapers are booming an alleged radical cure for tuberculosis discovered by Prof. Cervillo, of the University of Palermo, and published wonderful stories of the success of the remedy, which is called formalin. It is applied by means of subcutaneous injections.

NOVA SCOTIA GOLD.—Word was received in Halifax a few days ago to the effect that the workmen in the Lake Lode mine at Carribou had "struck it rich." The shaft is about 500 feet deep and it is said that the lead found is an extraordinarily rich one, it being calculated that there is now about \$10,000 worth of gold in sight. The mine is operated by the Guffey-Jennings Company, a Pittsburg concern.

IMPRISONED IN A WELL.—A London paper has a report of the remarkable rescue of a man at Brightlingsea from the bottom of a well. Samuel Webb was at work in a well 40 feet deep, when the sides caved. The earth did not bury him, but so closed the well above him that he was in dire peril. A force of rescuers began to work immediately. To dig in the well meant to throw down the earth upon Webb and kill him instantly. Therefore the rescue party dug a shaft beside the well and then a cross-cut, supporting the roof with beams so that a second cave could not endanger Webb and the men at work. When the rescue party began work Webb began to sing "Ho-koi-Age," and he continued to repeat the hymn for several hours, the length of time the men were at work digging the shaft and making the cross cut. His voice was very faint when he was lifted from his cramped position at the bottom of the well, and he was seriously hurt by the rocks and earth that fell upon him.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—When he was in opposition Sir Richard Cartwright characterized the supporters of our protective policy as "scoundrels great and scoundrels small." But now he is the chief defender of the Finance Minister, who has sounded the cry of Protective Tariff stability.

—The Ottawa correspondence of the Globe says that "there is a strong impression that Mr. Fielding's philosophical disregard for reciprocity is due in part to the certainty that the negotiations have utterly failed. Everybody here knows that there is not the slightest chance of an agreement at Quebec in August. Everybody in Washington knows that the negotiations have failed utterly. Reports from the United States capital are unanimously to the purpose that the Canadian representatives on the commission have been played with. They went to Quebec and to Washington not knowing what they wanted, and as a Washington editor remarks, not knowing what they didn't want. It is possible that some arrangement may be made about the boundary of Alaska and other purely scientific questions, but there is no possibility even remote of a trade bargain. For this deliverance we may offer fervent thanks, for if the Canadian commissioners should make a bargain it would undoubtedly be a bad one.

It is stated that the men who are still imprisoned for participation in the murder of Lord Frederick Cavendish, chief secretary for Ireland, and T. H. Burke, permanent under-secretary, in Phoenix Park on May 6, 1882, will be liberated on the Queen's birthday.
