Sees Third World War Possible

WINNIPEG (CP)—R. B. Currie of Ottawa, director of Civil Defence welfare services for Canada, says a third world war is possible and Canada could be the highway between the two main forces, Russia and the United States.

"Anyone who has any intelligence or who knows anything about Russia fully realizes that although the Russians have turned on the charm lately, their main objective is still to impose their economic, political and social system on the rest of the world," he said Wednesday.

He told delegates at the annual meeting of the Hotel Association of Canada he could not agree with "ostensibly Canadians who stick their heads in the sand and claim it can't happen here or if it does there's nothing you can do about it."

He listed four major steps in civil defence: interception of attacking enemy aircraft; warning of approaching planes; retaliation on enemy cities; dispersal and evacuation of the population.

Selling Not Quotas, Cure For N. E. Fisheries

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States tariff commission was told Thursday that sensible merchandising—and not quotas—is the cure for an ailing New England fisheries industry.

Leo Well, Louisville, Ky., president of the American Seafood Distributors Association, gave testimony at a hearing on requests for protection against increasing imports from Canada and other countries.

Well said a merchandising plan should include advertising on a large scale with contributions coming from both importers and the domestic industry.

The commission has heard proposals for an increase in duty on imported groundfish and quotas linked with average U.S. consumption. In recent years there have been big increases in imports of groundfish—cod, halibut and other fish which feed and are caught near ocean floor.

Well said there is already a trend downward in imports after the big increases of recent years.

Producers, union leaders and others have testified that the New England fisheries industry is facing disaster, that the fleet and fishing ports are deteriorating, and that unemployment in the industry has grown.

The view that the New England fishing fleet may not be so bad off came from Arthur Jarrell, of a Pittsburgh wholesale distributing firm.

Jarrell said he cannot believe "that in the main our fishing fleet is in the dire straits portrayed here."

Sardine Fishery Gets Under Way

PORTLAND, Me. (AP)—Sardine herring have appeared in Maine's coastal waters and the canning season, delayed a month, is finally under way.

Forty-two factories, from Portland to Jonesport, have started up their machinery.

John Toft, vice-president of the R. J. Peacock Co. said the herring season for the company's Portland factory are of good size and "elegant" quality.

Peacock's factory employs 300 and Toft said there is plenty of help.

But Richard E. Reed, executive secretary of the Maine sardine industry, said a shortage of experienced cannery men was more or less general elsewhere on the coast.

Because the business has been "up and down" for several years, many cannery employees have moved or gone into some other business, he said.

Last year's pack of about 1,250,000 cases was the smallest since 1939. In 1955 there was a record pack of almost 4,000,000 cases.

President Of Indonesia Asks For Understanding

OTTAWA (CP)—President Sukarno of Indonesia Tuesday asked Canadian understanding and sympathy for Asians and Africans.

The white-uniformed president made a moving, 35-minute speech before a joint sitting of the Senate and the Commons and was accorded a rare tribute—three standing ovations. Even the public galleries in the Commons stood and applauded.

Speaking in English and French, Dr. Sukarno said at one point: "Mankind the world over is basically the same whatever cultural or ideological details may appear to divide him. Understanding and sympathy are necessary."

"Active understanding and active sympathy will help relieve the strains and tensions in the world. This is really my message to you. Give us your understanding and your sympathy. Give us, if you can, your active understanding and your active sympathy."
