Inquest Ordered In Highway Death

SUMMERSIDE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN — An inquest has been ordered into the death of Capt. Donald Smith of the MV Abegweit of Borden who drowned Wednesday night when his car plunged into the Dunk River at Bedeque.

The car with Capt. Smith's body was raised from 15-feet of water early Thursday morning by a large crane from the RCAF Station at Summerside.

The car ripped off more than 12 feet of the guard rail on the bridge before plunging into the swirling waters. It is believed that slippery roads may have been partly to blame for the fatal mishap.

A long section of guard rail sliced through the front and interior of the car like a spear. The vehicle, a 1956 Buick, landed on its roof in the river.

NO EYEWITNESSES

There were no eyewitnesses to the accident but a passing motorist a short time later discovered a section of rail on the highway and noticed the hole where the car had gone through. He notified police and both the Summer-

Souris Local Elects Officers For Coming Year At Meeting

SOURIS — Local 321A of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway Transport and General Workers elected executive officers for the coming year at a meeting here Tuesday night.

D. F. Cheverle was re-elected as president while Herb Cheverle was re-elected as vice-president. This local represents employees of Eastern Fisheries Ltd. Usen Fisheries Ltd., Eastern Packing Company and Mathew and MacLean Ltd. About 100 members attended.

Other officers include: financial secretary, Miss Joyce McLellan (re-elected); treasurer, Warren Cheverle; recording secretary, Henry Paquet (re-elected); reporter, Michael LaVie; local chairmen, D. F. Cheverle, Eastern Fisheries Ltd.; Joseph Young, Usen Fisheries Ltd., Miss

Joyce McLellan, Eastern Packing Co., and Henry Paquet, Mathew and MacLean Ltd. The newly elected officers will assume office on January 1, and will serve for a one-year term. Local meetings are held monthly throughout the year except in July and August.

Retiring officer was Albert Mallard, Treasurer. Local 321 "A" was chartered by the brotherhood on July 9, 1959. The brotherhood, founded in Moncton in 1908, is Canada's largest national union, and also the nation's largest transportation union.

Tignish Men Draw Fines

SUMMERSIDE — Three Tignish fishermen drew fines on charges of having unlawful possession of lobsters when they appeared in County Magistrate's Court here yesterday morning.

Two brothers Joseph and John Pitre were fined \$75 and costs or 10 days each while Hector Pitre, a nephew, was fined \$50 and costs or seven days.

The trio had pleaded guilty to the charge at a hearing on Nov. 3.

A Summerside female resident was fined \$200 and costs or 30 days after pleading guilty to having possession of intoxicating liquor not purchased at a legal vendor.

Evidence revealed that the accused had in her possession 20 quarts of homemade beer.

A St. Roch resident pleaded not guilty to having the unlawful possession of a still suitable for the manufacture of spirits. He was remanded until Jan. 7 and released on his own recognisance.

SILICOSIS DECLINES

TORONTO (CP)—An extensive study of pulmonary diseases among hardrock miners in Ontario shows a sharp decrease in silicosis, the department of mines reported. Dr. John F. Paterson, on the faculty of the University of Toronto, says in his report the number of cases of silicosis dropped to seven in 1958 from 127 in 1926, and the average age of the victim increased to 62.9 years from 39.7 years during the same period.

NATIVE OF SCOTLAND

A native of Scotland, Captain Smith was an active member of both the Canadian Legion and the Lions Club in Borden.

He had been returning from Summerside to his home in Borden when the accident occurred. Road conditions were reportedly very treacherous with ice.

The death of Captain Smith brought to 27, the number of persons killed in highway accidents in P.E.I. during this year.
