**Contract for Printing New Edition of the Statutes of Prince Edward Island for the years 1863, 1864, 1865, 1866 and 1867.**

**P**ERSONS disposed to Contract for Printing Eight Hundred Copies of the Revised Public General Statutes, and One Hundred and Fifty Copies of the Revised Private Statutes of Prince Edward Island, passed in the years 1863, 1864, 1865, 1866 and 1867, and for Binding the same, are hereby informed that Tenders will be received by the undersigned Commissioners, appointed to superintend the same, until 12 o'clock, noon, on Wednesday, the Fourth day of December, next.

The Public and Private Statutes will form two separate Volumes, comprising, if in small pica, 230 pages and 170 pages, or thereabouts, respectively, and will form two separate Volumes.

Tenders to express the rate per Sheet of eight pages for each Volume. The Contractor will be required to print the Public Statutes first, and to complete the same within Four Months after commencing it, which he will be required to do on or about the 21st day of December next; and to complete the Private Statutes within Three Months thereafter. Both works to be printed in a good and workmanlike manner, either in the style of the Revised Statutes of Prince Edward Island, published in 1862, or of the Session Laws of the present year (1867,) a specimen of which, as well as of the Binding and of the quality of the Paper, may be seen, and other particulars made known, at the Office of Honorable Joseph Hensley, one of the Commissioners, where Sealed Tenders directed to the undersigned are to be sent.

Separate Tenders to be sent in for the Printing, which must express the rate, if printed according to the type and style of the Revised Laws or of the Session Laws, as the case may be, and separate Tenders for the Binding of the work; and the Tenders for the Binding to set forth the rate per Volume at which the Contractor or Contractors will Half Bind the same in Calf, and Half Bind the same in Sheep.

No Tenders will be noticed unless accompanied by a Letter addressed to the Commissioners, signed, if in reference to the Printing, by two (2) persons; and if in reference to the Binding, by two (2) persons of known responsibility, engaging to become Security for the due performance of the Contract.
