Western Journalists Shown Russia's New Huge Aircraft

PARIS (AP)—The Russians port of giant freight cargoes showed off the world's largest makes it the world's most economical Western journalists nominal aircraft. here. They said its trans- The Soviet minister of Aviation, Pyotr Dementiev, with spaceman Yuri Gagarin and famed designer Andrei Tupolev at his side, held a press conference for more than 80 correspondents in the 1 m m n a a, vaulted interior of the 250-ton plane, the four-engine, turbo-prop Antonov 22.

Oleg Antonov, designer of the plane, which stands five storeys high, also was present at the press conference at the Paris International Air Show at Le Bourget Airport.

Dementiev said the cost of shipping freight on the Antonov 22 works out to about five cents for every kilometre (3/4 mile) a ton of cargo is carried.

"This plane is thus the most economical way to transport freight to distant areas. We don't regard its speed of almost 500 miles an hour as slow. In any case, the Antonov 22 is a turbo-prop plane designed to land and take off on relatively primitive grass or dirt runways."

FEELS LIKE A SHIP
A visitor who climbs aboard the Antonov through one of 10 entrances gets the feeling he is going aboard a ship rather than a plane. The interior can accommodate three city buses.

Although the Antonov 22 is designed primarily for carrying freight to remote areas of the Soviet Union, designer Antonov said it can be converted to a seating capacity for 720 passengers.

When Should Forage Crops be Fertilized?

Under ordinary conditions 60-70% of pasture growth takes place by early July. The result is a shortage of feed in late summer.

To help extend pasture growth later into the summer use the following fertilizer recommendations:

- Mid June—300-400 pounds 6-12-12 per acre
- early August—300-400 pounds 6-12-12 per acre

Supplement with Nitrogen when required 100-200 pounds/acres Ammonium Nitrate.

Doctors Are Advised To Smoke In Private

HALIFAX (CP)—Doctors who persist in smoking cigarettes should do it in private so they don't give a bad example to the public, the Canadian Medical Association was told here.

In its final session of the 98th annual meeting of the CMA's general council approved a resolution asking individual physicians who still smoke cigarettes to consider the adverse effect of the habit on the public and their patients.

In their continuing concern for the link between cigarette-smoking and lung cancer, the association instructed the committee on cancer to consider prohibiting smoking in hospitals, having tobacco included in the Food and Drug Act and evaluation of the Tobacco Manufacturing Advertising Code.

Dr. R. K. Macoe of Peterborough, Ont., chairman of the committee, said he himself was a reformed smoker and none of the nine committee members smoked.

"This is the best example," said CMA secretary, Dr. A. D. Kelly of Toronto, to a press conference in which most reporters were puffing cigarettes. "Compulsion and legislation are less effective than the example set by doctors who quit cigarettes," he said.

STUDY MOTIVATION
Research on the motivation of smoking and how to meet the problem of the adult smoker now is under study.

The association also reaffirmed its recommendation for a national cancer registry to determine incidence, prevalence, and geographic distribution of various forms of cancer in Canada.

A broad statement of policy was adopted on the question of aging. Prepared by a committee headed by Dr. E. David Sherman of Montreal, the statement called for greater emphasis in education of doctors on the medical, social, and economic aspects of aging.

Programs were urged to stimulate interest among physicians in geriatrics (the science of aging) and to make facilities available to support doctors in early detection and long-term treatment of mental and physical disease in this group.

NEED NURSING HOMES
The number of persons working with the aged should be increased and long-term care in hospitals, nursing homes, and community programs should be developed. More research was required in the care of the aging and chronically ill.

A central bureau on aging for the co-ordination of information and stimulation of research will be recommended to the federal government.

A request for amendment to the criminal code concerning contraceptives was repeated by the CMA for the third time on a recommendation from the maternal welfare committee.

The code now makes it an offence to sell, advertise, or advise the use of any instrument that would prevent conception.

Provincial governments will be urged to pass legislation making information compiled by provincial maternal welfare committees "privileged" and not admissible in court.

The convention, with general council sessions complete, moves into the purely scientific end of its meetings today. It concludes Friday.

Objections To Redistribution Tough Problem For Members

OTTAWA (CP)—Sitting MPs face a difficult problem in making objections to the sometimes-unwelcome proposals to alter the shape of their constituency by the redistribution commissions.

They don't want voters to be added to their ridings are unwelcome. The effect might be that the voters would cast their ballots solidly against them.

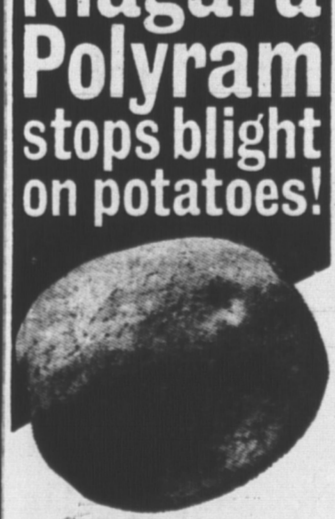
Nevertheless a fair number of MPs feel they have sound reasons for objecting to some of the changes proposed by the commissions. There are 10 commissions—one for each province—which are drawing new electoral maps detailing constituency boundaries.

A double machinery is provided for making objections. And the first stage of it provides a degree of anonymity so that an MP's individual objection can get before the commission without the MP appearing to be the author of it.

As the commissions publish their preliminary reports of new boundaries, they schedule public hearings to hear objections. In some cases, objections of MPs can be stated at these hearings by associates who don't have to count on getting voting support at the next election.

WRITE FINAL REPORT
Once the commissions finish public hearings, some are scheduled right into October—the commissions write their final report. In it, they either take into account the objections raised at public hearings or leave the proposed constituency

in the same shape it was in the preliminary report. The final reports then are placed before Parliament. It is here that the MPs get a second chance to raise objections to the proposed boundaries.

Any 10 MPs can file objections to the commission reports. In the case of Saskatchewan, for example, where there are no Liberal MPs, any 10 Liberal MPs from other provinces can raise objections to the final report of the Saskatchewan commission.

These objections must be made within 30 days of each commission's final report being tabled in the Commons. The House then has 15 days to dispose of them, either by referring the report back to the redistribution commission concerned or by rejecting the MP's objections.

If the report is referred back, the commission then has 30 days to decide whether to uphold the findings of its final report or make changes in accordance with the MP's objections.
