But could they not supply more black boards because right now I have notes made out of Architectural Geometry, English, and history all in one. Or am I mistaken and such a course exists around here?

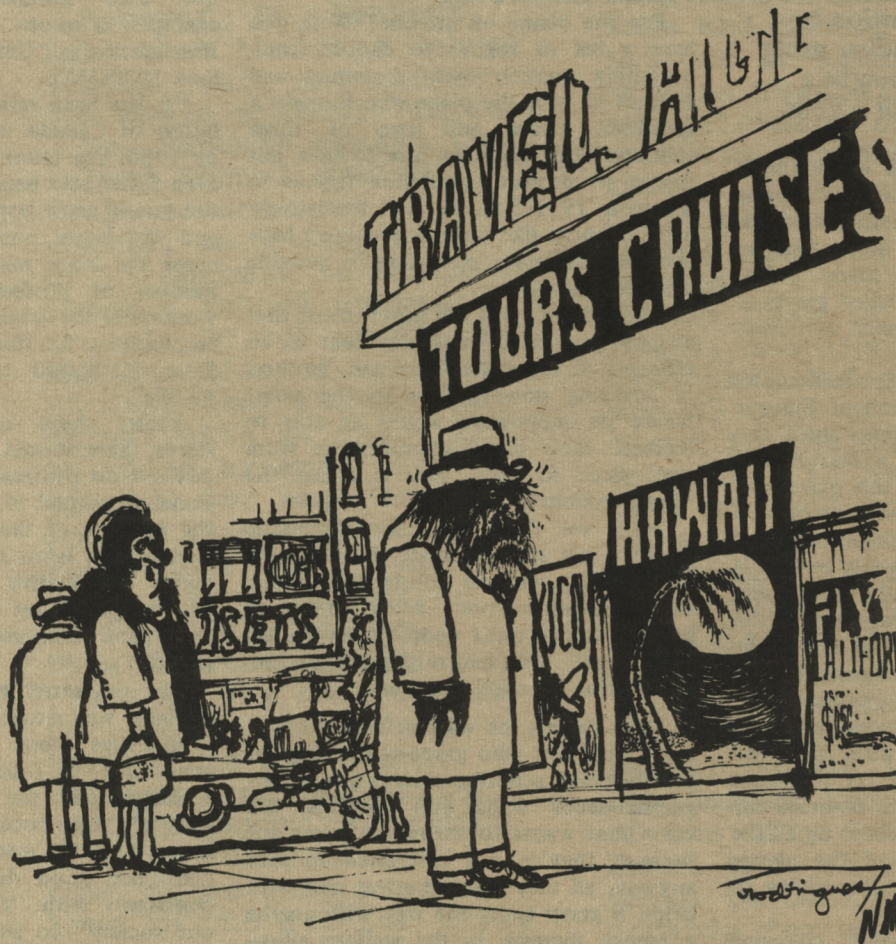
If nothing can be done about the chalk could they please supply each teacher (prof) with a wrist building kit so that they will be able to rub off a thick layer of chalk when they want.
