His reputation and his following were made on the sustained power of his story-poems. Born Feb. 4, 1883, he was the son of John Pratt, a Methodist clergyman at Western Bay, Nfld., and Fanny Pratt, daughter of a sea-captain. He was nearly 40 before he turned to poetry. Prices Cut For Choice Seats At The Coronation

By John Dudman LONDON. (Reuters) - Choice seats for the Coronation procession next June now are selling for as low as 10s. The demand for tickets has suddenly backed up and agents have slashed prices for the best grandstand seats. You now can get a seat in one of the bleachers not too far from Buckingham Palace for £26. That includes a first-class view of the whole medieval pageant, breakfast, a champagne lunch and tea. Some of the £26 places are in store windows along the route. Some offer television, too, so you can follow Queen Elizabeth right into the inner sanctuary in Westminster Abbey. The £16 bargain seats definitely are not in the "orchestra" category. Some of them catch the procession from a bad angle. In others you have to look down at the top of the Queen's and other Royal heads from second or third-floor windows. These "gallery" seats also carry no promise of champagne and such amenities, although the agents mention that there will be "refreshments." That could mean

WINNIPEG, (CP) - Trade was irregular and prices generally closed lower in dull trade on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange Monday. Overseas interest was lacking due to the Easter Monday holiday. Rye was sharply lower on selling influenced by declines on American markets, prompted by reports of heavy rains in the winter wheat belt. Commercial demand was limited in other grains, with oats and barley receiving minor domestic orders. Flax attracted some processor buying, but the offerings generally outweighed the demand. No information was available on export loadings of Canadian wheat. Prices for the top grades of class two wheat were down one cent from Thursday, IWA prices were unchanged. New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP) - The stock market suffered its sharpest break Monday since the week the Korean war started. It was estimated that more than \$2,500,000,000 was erased from the quoted value of all listed securities by Monday's fall. Prices were down from \$1 to around \$4 a share at the outside. Altogether there were 1,255 individual issues traded, second highest total in the history of the stock exchange. Monday's sharp fall was part of the decline that was triggered last week by Communist peace feelers. Wall street fears the economic effect of a change from a war to a peace footing in the nation's business.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined \$2.60 and closed at \$108.70. The fall was the greatest since June 29, 1950. Volume came to a little more than 3,000,000 shares, second highest this year. Among closing prices were Atlantic Coast Line Railroad off \$3 at \$106.50, Southern Railway off \$3.25 at \$82.50 and General Motors off \$2.25 at \$60.25.
