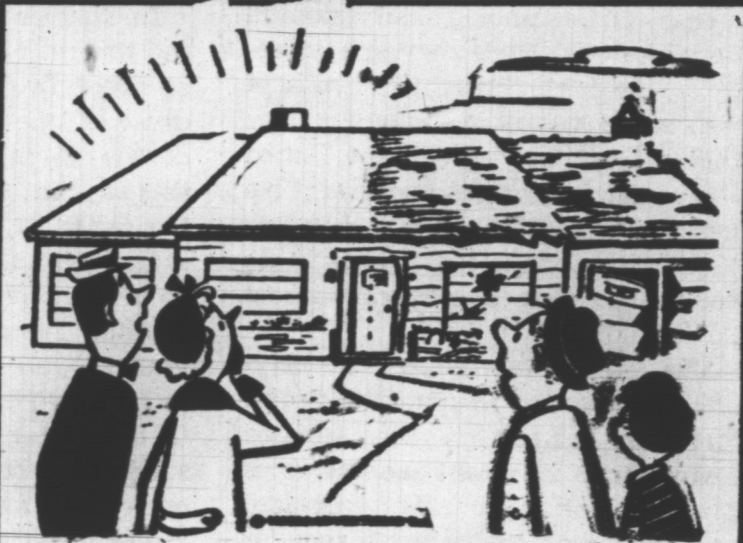

Increased Ferry Service Carrying Record Numbers

BORDEN — Federal members of parliament, Heath Macquarrie, Dr. Orville Phillips, and John A. Macdonald, yesterday afternoon visited Borden to inspect transportation facilities and the improved service which resulted from the planking of the deck of the S. S. Scotia II, enabling it to assist the two larger ferries in transporting motor vehicle traffic during rush periods.

Even as the federal members visited the Borden terminal the S. S. Scotia II docked with 43 autos and trucks, and departed again for Cape Tormentine with about half the deck area filled with motor vehicles.

The M.V. Abegweit with a capacity of 125 autos, the S.S. Prince Edward Island, 80 and the S.S. Scotia II, 60, for a total of 265, had their lightest day on the first day of the three-ship summer service inauguration on June 16,

when 330 vehicles were transported to or from the Island, and this increased to a peak of 1,323 on July 19th.

Mr. Macquarrie said the improved service had been so effective during this time no vehicles were left waiting at Cape Tormentine and only 25 were left at Borden, and no vehicles missed more than one trip.

In peak periods, including old home week, the three members of parliament said that extra trips will be made if there are autos left on either pier after the regular scheduled trips of the ferries.
