

**Inspection Objections Delay Uranium Deal With French**

LONDON (CP)—An executive of Rio Tinto Zinc Limited said here French government objection to Canadian inspection of French atomic plants is stalling negotiations of a \$250,000,000 uranium contract with two Canadian companies.

"It is a matter of French government principle and of national prestige," said A. F. Lowell, chief of the uranium section of Rio Tinto.

However, the French "are definitely interested" in the proposed 25-year contract with Rio Tinto, controlled by Rio Tinto, and Denison Mines, Lowell added in an interview.

He said there is no question of France using the uranium oxide for other than peaceful purposes and "they take the attitude that since they already have their own uranium and an atomic weapon, they should not have to submit to such an inspection agreement," which is designed to prevent the spread of nuclear arms.

**WANTS SAFEGUARDS**  
The Canadian government, which must give its approval before uranium can be exported, is asking for the usual bilateral agreement to ensure the uranium is used only for peaceful purposes. The treaty would give Canada the right to send inspectors to the receiving country.
