WHAT'S IN A NAME.

Rev. T. F. Fullerton, Presbyterian clergyman, of Charlottetown, was one of the chaplains with the first Canadian Contingent to South Africa, and while there he met with one of those unique little incidents, that happen occasionally in one's life, that is worth recounting, and that goes to show even this great world is too small to hide us from each other.

When Chaplain Fullerton was in Pretoria, he happened one day to pick up a book in some public building he was visiting, and on a fly-leaf he read the name "Neil Sedgewick Matheson." The name Sedgewick, to an orthodox Presbyterian from the Maritime Provinces, even in distant South Africa, would conjure up loving memories of his church's history, so Mr. Fullerton started to make inquiries as to the owner of the book in which this name was inscribed.

After some considerable search the Chaplain found installed in office in one of the Government Buildings in the Boer capital, a Mr. Matheson, and a little questioning brought out the fact that he belonged to New Glasgow, was born in Tatamagouche, and had been named for Rev. Thomas Sedgewick, D. D.

Mr. Matheson held an important office in Pretoria when the war broke out, and to save himself from expulsion from the city, perhaps from a worse fate, he became a United States citizen. He afterward did much to assist, aid, and provide for the British prisoners that were sent from the front for confinement in the dreary prisons of Pretoria; but he found that the Boers would steal, if they got the chance, all the clothing, or any supplies of food that friends might be able to get together for them.

Mr. Matheson provided clothing for Chaplain Fullerton, who, when he arrived in Pretoria, after that long and weary march, was not only far from dressed in any up-to-date clerical robes, but presented a sorry plight in his stained and ragged khaki uniform.

Mr. Matheson, who was so kind to the British prisoners in Pretoria, and who will long be remembered by Chaplain Fullerton, is a brother of Mrs. Ed. C. McLellan, of Tatamagouche.—TRURO NEWS.

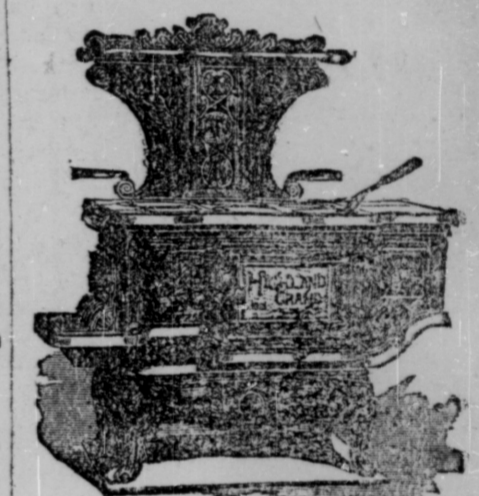
