Fine Provided For Violating Highway Order

Under Sec. 113 of the Highway Traffic Act, the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council may prohibit the operation of motor vehicles on all or any of the highways in the Province for such period of time in each year as may be deemed expedient.

Truck Licences

Sec. 103 of the Act also came in for discussion. This provides that the motor vehicle fees may be prescribed from time to time by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
