Rates Under M.F.R. Act Are Left Untouched

OTTAWA, March 15 (CP) -
The Federal statute giving the
Maritimes sub-normal freight
rates would be left virtually un-

The commission, in its report
tabled in Parliament today, pro-
posed two amendments to the

The statute provides for 30-per-
cent reductions from normal
freight charges on a large volume

One proposed change was that
Parliament write into the act a
provision that the reductions apply

Second amendment would cut
out a provision calling on the Can-
adian National Railways to keep

The Commission turned down a
number of requests in various
Maritime submissions for extending

One submission called for a 30-
per-cent rate reduction instead of

Rejection, too, was a request that
the city of Quebec be included in
the "select territory" covered by

The commission held that the
preferential rates were based on
historical and geographical factors

On another Maritime freight-
rate question, the Commission
suggested that the Board of Trans-
port Commissioners give consid-

These are fixed charges on the
Montreal-Maritimes portion of
hauls between the Maritimes and

The commission said the arbi-
traries are parts of through rates
and it would be unsound to keep
