Potato Price Is Unchanged

There was no change reported in the potato price here yesterday though one dealer said: "It is not going with prices still being low to the price."

It was learned from Agriculture that potato holdings are down sharply from the same time last year.

Holdings in the Maritimes are down 2.4 million bushels and the Ontario holdings are down 6 million bushels from this date the minister reported.

Maritime shipments as of December 10 were up 2,569 carloads over the same time a year ago, he said.

The updated figures on shipments followed several reports Tuesday that somewhat pressure is being exerted to lower the price, and a firm advice to growers by the minister not to sell for anything less than one dollar per 75-pound bag at the farm.

S'side Man narrowly Escapes from Flames

SUMMERSIDE — Summerside machine operator, Ernest Paynter, escaped without injury when an acetylene torch he was using ignited gasoline used for the start of a welder.

The fire started in the street from the electric light department about 4:30 yesterday afternoon.

In trying to escape from the closed building Mr. Paynter had difficulty in getting the side door open and said that it seemed to be "ten times more difficult than it usually is to open."

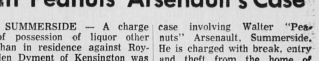

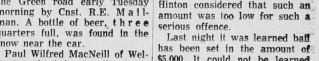

The Marine Wharf in Summerside Tuesday. Loading operations commenced in the afternoon. She has been chartered by Simmons and MacFarlane.



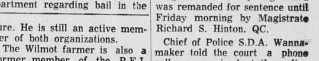
