**NEW YORK, May 26**—Again there is no outstanding news which might have any unusual effect on the market today. Sterling is a little higher, 4.98 and 3-16. Metropolitan papers report that Italy is irritated because of Selassie's trip to England. Great Britain is said to be stirred up on account of Italy's reported policy of India in Palestine and India by radio. The differences between these two countries seems to be getting wider and wider apparently.

Carloadings reports coming to hand will probably make a good showing. Dividend meetings scheduled today are—DeCrosley Radco, International Business Machine, National Lead, Rubberoid, and Western Oil and Snowdrift. We

would look for another quiet irregular market today with the regular orders probably doing better also. Commercial Credit, which is scheduled to have a dividend meeting on Thursday, and other merchandising, stocks.

**TORONTO, May 26**—McWatters' Gold-Royal section of Quebec's said to have encountered a new foot ore section on the 4th level. Details of the new find are not available at this time.

(Canadian Press)

**MONTREAL, May 26**—Prices were higher in the cattle, calf and hog sections in early dealings on Montreal livestock markets today. Sheep division held steady.

Receipts: Cattle, 645; calf, 2060; sheep, 277; hog, 1285.

Common steers were mostly \$4 to \$4.25, medium steers \$4.50 to \$5.25. A few early sales on good steers were at \$5.40 to \$5.65. Good cows made \$4.00 to \$4.25 with medium cows from \$3.25 to \$3.75 and common butchers from \$2.50 to \$3. Canners and cutters were from \$1.75 to \$2.25. Heifers ranged from \$3 to \$3.25.

Good quality veals sold up to \$7 with medium good kinds from \$6 to \$6.25. Medium kinds from \$5 to \$5.75. Common light veals sold as low as \$4. Mixed lots of common to just fair calves brought from \$4.50 to \$5.

Good quality spring lambs brought \$5 to \$6, each and common kinds as low as \$4.50 each. Sheep were from \$4 to \$5 with the bulk between \$4.50 and \$4.75.

Bacon brought 90 fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium. Butchers, heavies and lights were \$8.50 and extra heavies \$8. Feeders sold up to \$10 according to weight and quality. Sows were from \$5.25 to \$6.25 with a couple of young sows up to \$5.50.

## MINING

**TORONTO, May 26**—Moderate weakness in the afternoon pulled the mining share market down for a minor loss. The early trading had been vigorous with a strong price trend and a few issues of the gold group held the bulk of their gains till the close, but over the board the final tone was a bit heavy. The gold share index sagged 26 and the miscellaneous mines index dropped 90 to 128.90. Aggregate turnover was around the recent top at 2,590,000 shares. Preston with an advance of 45 cents set the pace. Consolidated Chibougamau followed with a net advance of 21 cents and Tashota with a gain of 20 cents. Kirkland Lake traded 1/4c higher than 150,000 shares, and finished 15 cents higher at 66. Gains up to 7 cents were recorded for Canadian Malartic, McKenzie, Macassa, Gunnar, Red Lake Gold Shore, Ventures, Sullivan and Sylvanite.

The big gods developed recessions. Lake Shore and McIntyre weakened 7-8 to 1-4 each and Dome closed down 1-4. Teck Hughes, the most active of the group slipped 5 cents and Wright Hargreaves 10.

Noranda advanced 3-4 and other base metals were quiet and steady. Castle was off 5 cents.

**NEW YORK, May 26**—Leading currencies held steady in terms of United States funds during today's dealings on the foreign exchange market. French gold francs went against the general trend however.

Domion funds remained unchanged at 99 13-16 cents, pounds sterling gained 1-16 cent to \$4.99 1-16 while French gold francs were off 1-8 point at 6.58 3-8 cents.

**MONTREAL, May 26**—Leading currencies showed little change on Montreal foreign exchanges today. Found sterling eased 1-8 cent to \$4.99 1-32 while the United States dollar was off 1-16 cent at 3-16 premium. The French franc remained unchanged at 6.60 cents.

**MONTREAL, May 26**—Potato prices advanced 15 to 20 cents a bag on Montreal open produce markets today. Butter, eggs and cheese were about even.

Potatoes: P E I mts 90's \$2 to \$2.10; cobbler's 90's \$1.90 to \$2; N. B. mts 80's \$1.75 to \$1.80; 50's \$1.10 to \$1.15; 10's \$4-25. Que no 2 whites 80's \$1.85 to \$1.90; South Carolina no 1 new barrel \$8.50 to \$9; no 2 \$7 to \$7.50.

Butter was quoted at 20 to 20 1-2 cents per pound for carlots or less for no 1 while lots to retailers were quoted at 21 for solids and 21 1-2 for prints.

Cheese was again quoted at 12 cents per pound for no 1 Ontario colored and 12 1-2 for white.

Graded egg shipments were quoted at 20 1-2 to 22 cents a dozen for A large, 19 1-2 to 20 for A medium, 19 to 19 1-2 for B and 18 1-2 for C.
