Many people are wondering what has been happening with the Woman's Committee on campus since it had its controversial beginnings a few weeks ago. A second, unadvertised meeting was held to discuss in detail the Women's Centre and the buddy system. This meeting was attended by Jim Griffith, Director of Student Services who gave the support and information regarding the Women's Centre on campus. Mr. Griffith, Father Callah, Rev. Trantiffiun and myself met a few days before this second meeting and decided that the location of the new Women's Centre would be the Chaplaincy Centre. This location has the advantage of geographic accessibility and also fufills the committee's space requirements. Student Services will be operating a drop-in centre for all students in the Chaplaincy Centre during the daytime and the Women's Committee will be running their drop-in centre at night. The upper foyer of the Chaplaincy Centre will be used as a coordinating base for the buddy system at night from 6-12 each night of the week.

The Women's Centre shall also function as an information depot regarding all upcoming activities planned by the Women's Committee. The drop-in centre is a nice quiet place to study or to just relax with friends where coffee will be available at a nominal fee. As with most organizations this committee was formed to respond to an

apparent need; to be truly effective, it requires that people make use of the services offered - this is what we are asking the university community to do.

All of this presupposes that we receive volunteer support. It is not enough that this committee has received endorsement from various individuals and groups both from within the university community and the community at large. We need people to help us by being a buddy or working at the centre answering the phone at night. A sign-up sheet for shifts will be posted in the Women's Centre on a regular basis. Even if you can only work once or twice during to remainder of the semester, you will be a definite asset in improving the conditions and safety on this campus.

Various members of the Women's Committee are soliciting names on an individual basis however this is a rather arduous method of getting people to help. Another means of achieving this end would be to elicit support from the many sub-organizations on campus. Already two such groups have given their support to both the committee and to the buddy system by having their members work as buddies.

If possible, I would like to suggest a meeting with the executive members from various groups such as academic societies, faculty associations, athletic teams, residence committees etc... I will be distributing a letter to this effect regarding time and place but in the meantime perhaps the various executive could address the issue with their respective memberships.
