

## Many New Zealand War Medals Lying Unclaimed

WELLINGTON, N.Z. (CP)—Ten years after the Second World War a huge pile of tarnishing metal and mouldering ribbons lies in store in Wellington. They are the war medals earned by New Zealanders—medals no one wants.

New Zealanders in all services earned 394,000 medals during the war, including campaign stars and service awards. Of these only 101,726 have been claimed. The remainder, 292,274 of them, still await their owners.

It seems New Zealanders are not interested in medals any more. "I couldn't care less," says the average veteran.

There is also a feeling of resentment among a large number of veterans. After the First World War, medals were engraved with the owner's name and sent to home addresses without application.

**SYSTEM CHANGED**

It was decided after the Second World War, however, to discon-

tinue the practice of engraving the medals, and those entitled to them were asked to fill in a form setting out their qualifications and requesting the medals to be forwarded.

Large numbers of veterans declared the medals should be sent to them as of right without their having to apply, and that they were worthless if not engraved with their names. They refused to make application and that attitude has prevailed to the present time.

Meanwhile the medals and miles of ribbon continue to lie in store and are a source of growing embarrassment to the government. They occupy needed storage space and it would now be impossible to send them to the owners owing to changes of address.

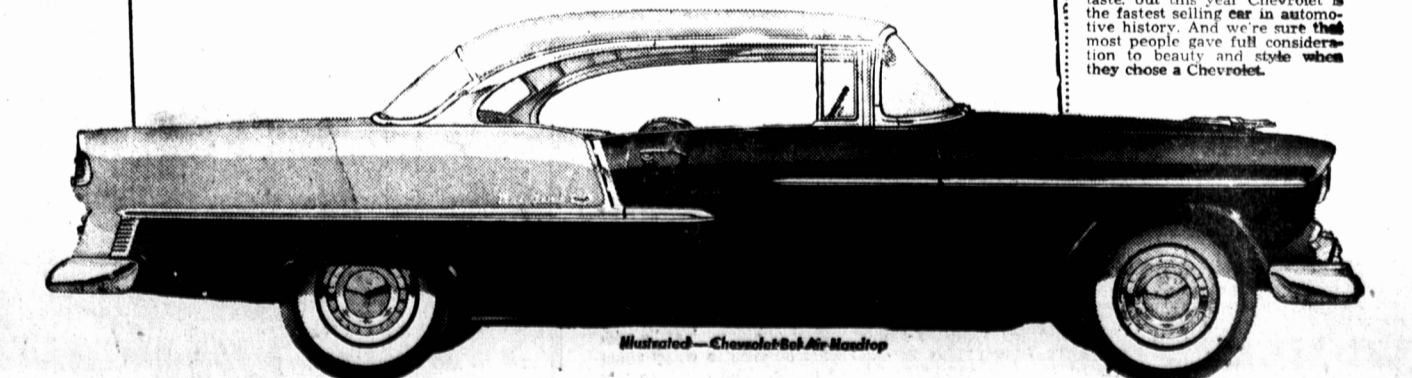
