Grain

WINNIPEG, Nov. 28 — (CP) — Prices were somewhat irregular today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. However, in most cases, early losses were erased. Others were reduced.

Early in the session, Korean war developments prompted selling. This along with heavier hedging sent prices lower. However, the offerings decreased late in the trade and prices moved upward.

Strength of United States wheat was reflected in rye trade here. Winnipeg rye also gained strength on reports of export business of about 200,000 bushels of this commodity to Norway.

Flax moved lower throughout most of the active session. Export loadings of Canadian wheat included 620,000 bushels for the United Kingdom, 350,000 for Israel, 350,000 for France, 365,000 to Germany and small lots to Belgium and Colombia.
