

## Recovery Of Treasure Trove Is Hailed As Great Event

LOUISBOURG, N.S. (CP)—Mayor George Lewis of this famous old town of 1,300 says the discovery of \$700,000 in gold and silver coins off the coast here is "the greatest thing that could have happened to this town." He searched for three years through fierce rip tides and over jagged rocks. And when they found the loot—pay for French soldiers that went down with the supply ship Le Chameau off here Aug. 26, 1725—they brought it to the surface in 20 days. "It was difficult to keep from talking," said Harvey MacLeod, 55, who found the treasure along with Alex Storm, 29, and Dave MacEachern, 29.

J. W. Stephens of nearby Sydney, a coin dealer and sole agent for the treasure, wasn't happy that the story had leaked. He felt it might affect the price of the coins.

But Halifax coin expert Charles Longley said he didn't think the hoard would affect the over-all market.

The provincial secretary's department was given five per cent of the find as half payment of 10 per cent demanded by the province of all treasure trove.

## Winter Works Likely Ending On April 15

OTTAWA (CP)—There is little chance the federal government's municipal winter works program will be extended beyond its expiry date of April 15 this year, Labor Minister Nicholson said today.

Mr. Nicholson told William Skoreyko (PC—Edmonton East) 15 extra days were added to the program for this year when the effective dates were announced last fall.

MPs from several Canadian cities have asked for an extension to aid municipalities whose projects have been delayed by winter storms.

The labor minister said the matter has been referred to officials for study but added he would be "less than frank" if he held out much encouragement for an extension.

He said that situations similar to that affecting Edmonton occurred during the 1963-64 season in Quebec, and in 1964-65 in British Columbia.

The government pays part of the labor costs for works projects carried out by the municipalities under the program.
