### GREENVALE SCHOOL ANNUAL CLOSING

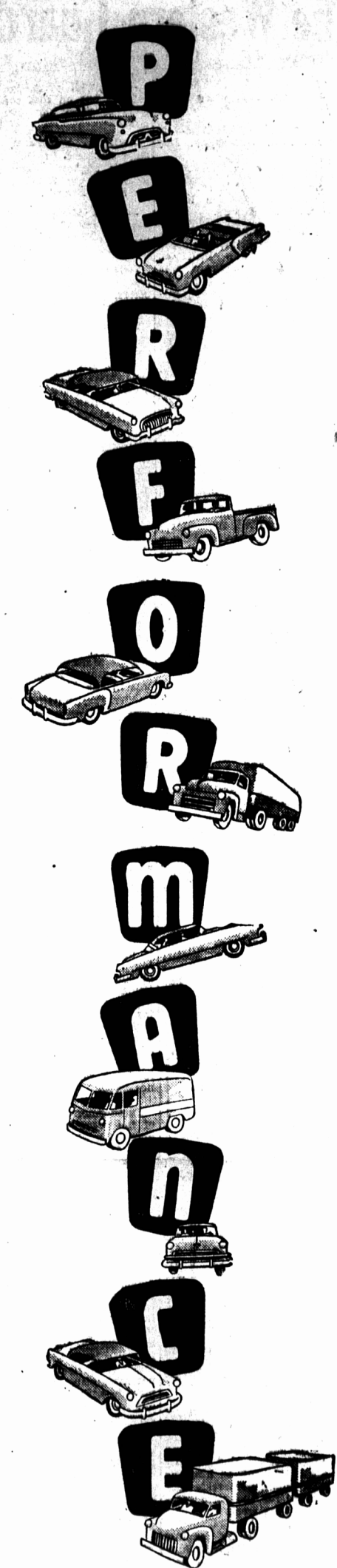
