

How to Prevent Wrinkles.

Wrinkles are marks of age that no woman desires, although they will come in spite of our wants. A preventive for early wrinkles will be found in friction with a good flesh-brush, or an electric one if possible. A good remedy is to bathe where the wrinkles appear in alum and water, which will tighten the skin, or wash daily in tonic water made with lemon peel, etc., for really it is a tonic that is desired to tighten and strengthen the skin. Lemon juice with a little sugar dissolved in it is said to be a good remedy for freckles. A teaspoonful of glycerine in a pint of water is good for bathing the face, and is a protection against freckles and sun-burn.

Household Hints.

INCREASING DEAFNESS.—Defective hearing is growing more prevalent in the United States. Says Dr. Sexton, it produces in children at first the appearance of stupidity and then the reality. They do not hear sounds distinctly, and, of course, they cannot imitate sounds accurately. Defects in the teeth are a great cause of this lamentable calamity in the young, and this is a fresh reason for avoiding quick applications of so-called dentists and keeping to pure soap and water in cleaning the teeth.

UNFERMENTED WINE.—To make an unfermented drink of pleasant flavour from grapes:—Mash the grapes; boil or not, as convenient—by boiling more colour is extracted from the skins—then press. When it is desired to bottle it, sweeten the juice to taste with best white sugar, fill the bottles, set them upon a wooden foundation in a boiler, surround them with water up to the necks, bringing to a boil, and boil for ten minutes. Then from one of the bottles fill the rest, to make up loss by evaporation, and cork them while hot. The sulphurous acid gas impregnating the juice will be volatilized and driven off by the heat.

A Winnipeg despatch of the 27th ult., says: A ten-mile race was run here yesterday by Geo. Irvine, champion of Canada, and Little Plum, son of the chief of the Blackfeet Indians. A number of fouls occurred. Finally Irvine knocked the Indian down, and severely injured him by stamping on his wrists with spiked shoes. Nevertheless the Indian regained his feet and renewed the race, winning by five yards in fifty-five minutes, and fell fainting at the winning-post. The excitement was intense. Many thousands were present and betting was 2 to 1 that Irvine would win.

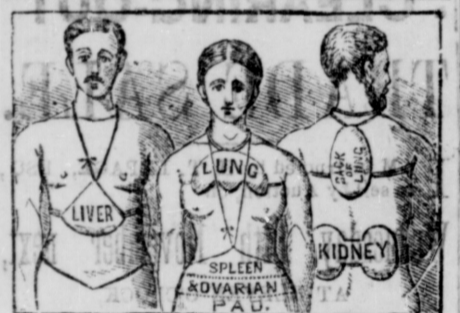
