ST. ANNS, N.S. (CP)—The official bard and historian of the worldwide clan MacMillan said Wednesday the Gaelic mod held annually here since 1939 is a farce and a phoney.

Mr. MacMillan, who said he was speaking as a private citizen rather than as an official of the clan MacMillan, reserved his strongest criticism for Rev. A. W. R. MacKenzie, director of the mod, an annual gathering of members of Scottish clans.
