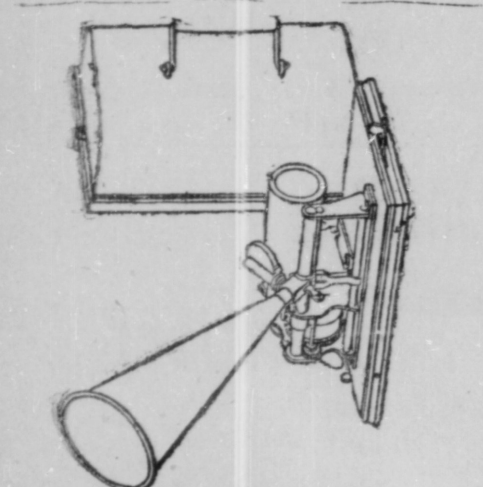

FRENCH-CANADIAN OPINION.

We have no doubt that La Presse of Montreal, represents the opinion of the French-Canadian people of Quebec much more accurately than La Patrie, the Montreal organ of the Liberal government. La Presse says:—

"French-Canadians, like other nationalities can appreciate the full value of British prestige. The war is now our war, which we are to carry on in Africa. On no point of the globe must the success of our arms be allowed to weaken. It will be time enough later on to discuss the causes of this urgency and mistakes, if any have been made. It is true that cavalry and artillery are military specialties, for which the majority of our compatriots are unprepared and which will limit the enlistment, but we have reason to believe that it will be possible to find a sufficient number of brave men to represent us worthily. It is more than probable that the sending of a corps to the Cape will not be all, for England can without fear withdraw her garrisons from Canada, and no doubt she will do it. We can make up for them, and as we suggested some weeks ago, garrison duties would be a fine school for our militia. England will be still living tomorrow. If today we can offer only raw troops of whom we ourselves know very little, we could soon furnish others upon whose efficiency there could be no misgiving. We hope that the present crisis will bring about this innovation and much good will thus have been done. For the moment there is no time to lose, and let us act most promptly. The interests of Canada are so woven with the British name that since the last reverses our financial operations are all turned over. Since the beginning of the war all new undertakings have been paralyzed and no others can be launched, and we accept the word of leading business men whose say that they are completely disarmed."

This is said and deliberate opinion, showing a correct knowledge of French-Canadian feeling, and also of the facts and tenderness of the situation.

NEWS NOTES.

China, out of whom Japan was supposed to have knocked all the fight, seems to think that France is about its size, and is evidently rather inclined to "take on" that power. It remembers that in the Tonquin war it was almost a match for France. We hope Mr. Farte will not deem it necessary to raise a Canadian contingent to go to the rescue of his beloved country.

Sixty delegates, representing missions at ports all the way from Montreal to New Orleans, met in Boston recently in the first convention ever held to discuss work among seamen.

Queen Victoria makes her own tea. It is black and costs about \$1.15 a pound.

France Sending Troops.

New York, Dec. 25.—A despatch from Port of Spain, Trinidad, says that news has been received there that 5,000 troops have been sent by France to Guadaloupe and Martinique. It is believed that the increase in troops is the outcome of the recent reference in the French Chamber of Deputies to Joseph Chamberlain's speech at Leicester, and of the demand for the protection of the colonies.

Krupps Making Shell for Britain.

BERLIN, Dec. 25.—An Eisen local paper announces that Krupp are making 25,000 steel shells for the British army on a "rush" order, and that the men are working night and day.

General Lawton's Widow.

WASHINGTON, D. C. Dec. 24—A bill granting a pension of \$2,000 a year to the widow of General Lawton, who was killed yesterday in the Philippines, is before Congress.

Buller's Suggestion.

MANCHESTER, Dec. 24.—The Guardian's London correspondent learns that Gen. Buller personally suggested the appointment of Gen. Roberts and Kitchener as Commander-in-Chief and Chief of Staff in South Africa.
