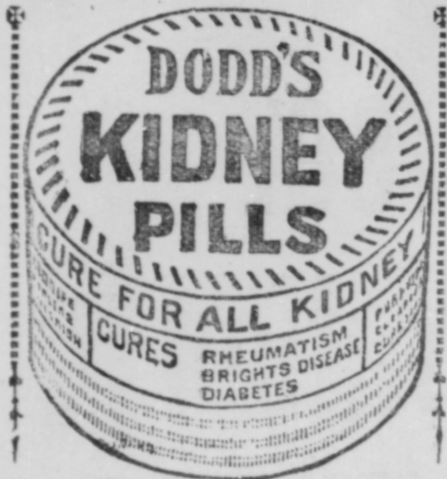

**The Scallop.** The scallop accomplishes locomotion by a series of leaps. When it is alarmed, or wishes to change its location, it opens and energetically closes its valves, thus expelling the water. The reaction shoots it backward. By this means the creature is able to travel long distances. Sometimes scallops make considerable journeys in large companies. One can scarcely imagine a lovelier sight than that of a flock of these pretty creatures, with shell of every hue, from purple and white to black, enlivened with shades of pink, yellow and fawn, darting about in clear water. In their flightlike movements, vertical, horizontal and zigzag, they are more suggestive of a flock of winged animals than of bivalve mollusks.

**Ice In Polar Regions.** When the sea freezes, first is formed the thin flake called by navigators "sludge," and as soon as this catches and holds snow it is termed "brash." When it gathers and doubles, the whalers style it "pancake" or "bay ice." If you can see the limit of this, it will be "a floe," and an "icefield" if its boundaries are out of sight. "Pack ice" consists of floes forced together and overlapping, and when this again becomes broken and scattered by a new wind the name of it is "sailing ice."
