SECURES GOOD SCHOONER.—Capt. Frank Boudreau of Vernon River has purchased the schooner Boness from Wright Bros. Crapaud and the vessel is now at Lyons' wharf. The vessel will leave for Sydney in a few days, and will ply between Charlottetown and Sydney during the coming months.

AROUND THE WHARVES.—The dredge Prince Edward, owned by the Prince Edward Island Dredging Co., was launched Saturday morning from Peake's dockyard after undergoing extensive repairs, and when those repairs are completed she will be in readiness to proceed digging mussel mud to supply the many farmers throughout the island. The tug "Pekin" is also hauled out and is now under repair. Several planks have been removed from the side of this staunch little craft, which were damaged by ice some years ago while towing in Grand River. When the frame was exposed, it was pronounced by reliable authorities present, to be the best frame ever seen in any wooden vessel in this part of the country. It is mostly elm, and as sound today as when the boat was built. When repairs are effected the tug will be one of the strongest hulls in the Maritime Provinces. This company, which has been recently incorporated, are to be commended for their enterprise and we hope to see the farmers patronize the company, who will deliver fertilizer at lower rates and of as good quality as the imported product.

## Mammoth Battle Scenes in Fox Spectacle "Queen of Sheba"

Next to the thrilling chariot race between Sheba and Vashti, which opens a two days engagement at the Strand today, perhaps the most spectacular scene in the mammoth William Fox spectacle, "Queen of Sheba" is the great battle between the armies of Solomon and his brother Adonijah, with Sheba's army coming up at the crucial moment to save the day. When it is considered that over six thousand men are engaged and the greater part of the fighting takes place on and around the massive Tower of David—which, built for the production, has to bear the weight of many hundreds of armoured men rushing to and fro—the magnitude of the task of J. Gordon Edwards, the director may be realized. Miss Betty Blythe, the Sheba of the picture, brought with her to New York a fund of stories of incidents that occurred during the making of the film on the west coast, and it was the battle scenes that left the most vivid impression on her mind. "The day and nights we worked on the battle scenes," she said in an interview, "were the most exciting I ever had. Imagine a great city square, surrounded by massive Babylonian buildings and packed with surging humanity. I had seen that square filled with a gay crowd of citizens in merry colors, dancing girls, priests, soldiers and Arabs, for the arrival of Sheba at Solomon's court, but now, for the bat-

tle, the scene was very different. "Directed by bugle calls which were ordered by the director over a system of field telephones, the crowds were a series of groups of people, each group having a specific part to play; while I stood in my chariot waiting for the signal to call me to rush in with my men. "First the women of the court, at the first alarm of the attack by Adonijah's army, rushed up the steps of David's Tower and along the great spiral ramps to the top. Solomon's army sallied through the gates of the palace, to be turned back by the pikes and arrows of the invaders. "Many cameras were playing on detailed bits of action, so that the screen shows even more than an observer on the spot could have seen; nevertheless the whole mighty pageants stirred my blood and made me feel that I was really and truly the Queen of Sheba, riding, like Boadicea, in the forefront of battle to deliver by people. I had even forgotten Betty Blythe. "The great battering ram of Adonijah beat down the heavy gate and the men rushed through the breach like a flood, carrying all before them. I saw Raymond Nye, playing Adonijah, my enemy rushing forward at the head of his men, and I felt sure he must go down in the crush. I sighed with relief when I saw his head again a few minutes later—and therein, perhaps, I was a bit out of character, for the Queen of Sheba would have been glad to see Adonijah go down. "Then when all the fighting men were on the spiral ramps, swaying back and forth with tide of battle, the signal came for our advance, and forward we went. I never was so thrilled in my life. Not even the chariot race had given me such exhilaration. My four Arabian horses behaved like warriors, never halting at the ramps, but went straight into the mass of Adonijah's men. I saw Adonijah himself go tumbling down from the top of the Tower into the deep moat. His army swirled past me as my horses tore forward. I saw Solomon step out to meet me, and I knew the battle was over. "Not many women get so near to a battle as that, and I understand now what I didn't understand before—the thrill men get out of fighting. "And Miss Blythe's impression of the battle before the palace of Solomon is less vivid, because lacking in detail than that of the picture audience, which sees not only the wide sweep of the battleground but also close-up incidents of the great fight.
