**Local and Other Items.**

**MISSION.**—The Dominican Fathers are to open a mission at Halifax next week.

**DYNAMITE BY MAIL.**—A package, six inches long, two inches wide and two inches deep, with a wrapping of manila paper and tied with a string, was received in the general post office, New York, a few days ago, addressed to Mayor Van Wyck. The package happened to break and a dynamite cartridge four inches long was exposed. A fuse was attached to one end of the cartridge.

**WHERE MONEY IS SCARCE.**—It sounds queer, but it is the truth that money is scarce in Dawson City. Men are working at a good rate of wages, but their pay, like that of the mine-owners, lies locked till spring. Money commands fifteen to twenty per cent. Bank-notes are at a premium. God dust passes current in the stores at \$17 to the ounce. Its coinage value is about \$15 to \$19. It is received in large amounts at only \$16.50.

**EXHIBITION OF PATRIOTISM.**—A woman in Central New York has offered her twin babies, whom she describes as fine boys, 11 months old, to the Secretary of the Navy, as mascots. She prefers that they should be placed upon the Iowa and New York of Admiral Sampson's fleet, as she says she knows more about those ships than any others in the navy. But she is not particular, as long as the infants are honoured by cradles upon American cruisers. This is the most peculiar exhibition of patriotism that has yet been offered.—Chicago Record.

**NEW RECORD MADE.**—A new record has been established in the time of converting wool on the sheep's back into a suit of clothes. Thomas Kitson, of the Stroud & burg mills in Pennsylvania, had six sheep shorn at 6.30 o'clock in the morning. The wool was then sorted, scoured, dried, carded, spun, woven into cloth, and the cloth was given to the tailors and made up in a suit of clothes, which were given to Mr. Kitson at 12.34 o'clock, or six hours and four minutes from the time of shearing. The best previous record was about eight hours.

 The Hon. George Curzon, who married beautiful Miss Leiter, is decidedly canny. Rossland is very proud of the big payment of \$500,000 made the other day by the British America corporation on account of the purchase of the celebrated Leroy Mine in that camp. It is one of a series, the purchase price being three millions of dollars. The entire agreement, says the Rossland Miner, made by Colonel I. N. Preyton with the B. A. C. was cabled from London to Spokane. There were 1,420 words in the message and the cost was \$570. The principal beneficiaries of the sale live in Spokane, but W. J. Harris, of Rossland, is credited with about 40,000 shares, worth at \$5 per share \$200,000. The Preytons, Valentines, E. N. and W. A. are jointly the holders of \$950,000 worth of stock, while the Turner interests are listed at \$522,000. Colonel Redpath is reputed to hold \$230,000 worth of stock.
