Sullivan, rector of SDU since June 11, 1964 has been named pastor of St. Lawrence and Little Flower Churches at Morell, effective three months from now, and was succeeded by Bishop MacEachern.

ORDAINED AT MONTAGE

Msgr. Sullivan, a native of Greenfield, P. E. I., attended Prince of Wales College from 1916-19 and graduated from SDU in 1923. He spent two years at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., 1935-36, where he obtained his master's degree in philosophy. He was professor of philosophy for many years at SDU.
