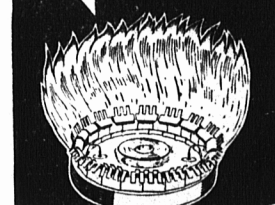

Strange But True

In early times funerals took place by night, but later on the morning was commonly the appointed time, especially for public funerals.

A custom among the Romans was to bury their dead seven days after death. This time lapse before burial took place was for the purpose of crying aloud the name of the dead, either to recall the soul or to reawaken its powers.

An amusing part of the ancient Roman ritual was, that apart from the mourners, there were musicians with pipes and trumpets and men who mimicked the actions and speech of the dead person.

It was then the custom to burn the body, and the funeral pyre, in the shape of an altar. The nearest relative of the deceased lighted the funeral pyre.

The Romans believed that unless their dead received fitting burial the spirits would return to haunt them.

Under the Roman law the Kings had the power to punish criminals themselves.

The Acadian bride-to-be, in order to qualify for the matrimonial state, had to master the art of weaving homespun while her husband was supposed to know how to fashion a pair of wooden wheels.

Blasphemy was a punishable offense in French Canadian law when, as early as 1636, a French Canadian was pilloried in the market place.
