

### Murder Preliminary Hearing At Montague

Five witnesses were heard in the preliminary hearing of Elmer O'Connor charged with murder in the death of William MacKenzie of Glen Martin, 65-year-old farmer who died at the Kings County Hospital on June 21. The hearing last night was conducted by Stipendiary Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet. Mr. J. P. Nicholson represented the crown, and Mr. R. B. Bell, C.C., represented the accused.

The first witness, Const. Ron Pettit, RCMP, Montague Detachment, stated that at 10.25 p.m., D.T., on June 18, he went with Const. Peter Austin to the home of William MacKenzie at Glen Martin. The house was in darkness; shone a light in the window and saw a man lying on the bed.

Went in and found man to be bleeding profusely and in an unconscious condition. Carried him to car and took him to the Kings County Hospital. Later accompanied Cpl. Don Davis back to house. Saw screen door on ground. Saw signs of a struggle, broken chair in porch and in bedside back door. These things were taken, and later we patrolled the Glen William Road towards highway. Found a truck in ditch and registration in compartment.

Truck registered in name of Elmer O'Connor. He was not anywhere about. Later that morning (Sunday), Const. Austin and I drove to Gladstone and contacted O'Connor at home of his parents. A statement was taken at this time, and returned to detachment. Later returned with Cpl. Davis and arrested O'Connor.

who took photographs. Measurements were taken and other articles were near the same spot where the bottle was found. Saw some pieces of stained wood. Near gate found two inches in diameter long and two inches in diameter bed clothing was removed for exhibits. Later accompanied Dr. G.S. A. Inman who obtained samples of blood from deceased and also from accused.

Cpl. Davis then identified each of the exhibits and explained the photos.

On cross-examination he explained the layout of the house saying that the downstairs comprised a porch, kitchen, bedroom, store room, and pantry. Upstairs was one large room. The bedroom downstairs was off the kitchen. A double bed both upstairs and down, and both apparently used. Did not know the O'Connors lived there. Did not know MacKenzie or the O'Connors previously. Learned later that they were both carpenters, and O'Connor employed at Kinkora.

Eldon Claire, Ottawa, pharmacy scientist with RCMP laboratories gave evidence regarding exhibits presented to him by Const. Humphrey at Ottawa for examination. Hand axe—found nothing. Four foot stick—found nothing. On a stained piece of wood found stains to be human blood. Found blood stains on right side of trousers. Found plot beside his loving wife and shirt, tests not conclusive but indicated group O. Coat—found blood on collar and right front. Could be continued on Page 13

### Magistrate's Court At Georgetown

At Magistrate's Court at Georgetown yesterday before Stipendiary Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudet, a party from Murray Harbor charged with possession of liquor not purchased at a vendor was fined \$25 and costs. A party from Gander, Nfld., charged with the unlawful possession of a liquor permit, being under the age of 21 years, was fined \$20 and costs.
