Unemployed On Benefits Shows Drop

OTTAWA (CP) — The number of persons receiving unemployment insurance benefits had declined slightly to 294,600 Aug. 29 from 300,000 July 31, the bureau of statistics reported Tuesday. On Aug. 30, 1957, claimants numbered 208,700.

August benefits totalled \$19,500,000, down 27 per cent from July's payments of \$26,800,000 but 50 per cent higher than the \$13,000,000 outlay for August, 1957. Weekly benefits averaged \$20.19 per claimant during August, \$20.67 during July and \$20.01 during August last year.
