

### High School Competitions On Tonight

### Federation Meeting Fri. To Clear Views

"Variations in opinion" over one-desk selling and also the idea of a new potato marketing board will be discussed at a meeting of the executive of the provincial federation of potato producers on Friday, according to Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae. The meeting will take place in Mr. MacRae's office at eight o'clock. The "variation in opinion" resulted from two meetings, one of the potato growers, and the other of the provincial potato producers' association directors, both of which were held last week. Growers endorsed the idea of one-desk selling and a new marketing board to be composed of three growers from each county. Producers' association directors rejected the idea of one-desk selling, and wanted the present board to remain longer in office. They also wanted potato dealers on the new board if it should come into existence. The government had announced willingness to recognize a new board. Friday's meeting, it is hoped, will clear up the difficulty.
