Approaches To Montague Bridge Near Completion

Today the approaches to the new Montague bridge will be completed when the final pouring of concrete for the roadway takes place. Begun about two months ago, the work has now reached its final stages and traffic will be permitted on the bridge within a few weeks. The railing on either approach and two light standards remain to be completed.

It is thought possible that the present crew may also complete the new sidewalk at the north and south ends to join it up with the present sidewalk. A section of the old sidewalk was covered by fill in order to permit traffic on the temporary bridge. It is hoped that the new sidewalk will be completed at the present time so that all may have use of the bridge as soon as possible.

The completion of the approaches has given the bridge a finished look, and it is most pleasing to the eye when viewed in its full length, which owing to the plan, brings the approaches in harmony with the bridge so that all appears as one, making the bridge seem much longer than it actually is. It is a job well done, and with the removal of the former bottleneck at this point there will undoubtedly be an upsurge of traffic in transport through this area to export points which should effect in no small degree, the economy, not only of the community, but of the county as well.

IN MEMORIAM MRS. WILLIAM MACLEAN

Pension Plan, H-Bomb Discussed At United Church General Council

Canadian Press Staff Writer SACKVILLE, N. B. (CP) — The United Church general council completed through what a speaker called "confusion twice confounded" Thursday to adopt a radically different pension plan providing broader and increased benefits.

The issue basically was whether ministers would all get the same pension or pensions governed strictly by the size of their incomes.

The old system guaranteed a uniform pension. Under the new one, the old pension benefits will be increased by 20 per cent to \$30 for each year of service by most ministers. A proviso states that pensions which accrue after Jan. 1, 1955 will be at the rate of \$30 for clergymen receiving \$2,400 or less and 1-1/4 per cent of salaries for ministers receiving more than \$2,400.

Ministers who do not contribute now because of one technicality or another will be permitted to contribute after Jan. 1 so that they may increase their pension potential.

DEATH BENEFITS BOOSTED

The scheme also provides financial protection for certain classes of widows not previously eligible for pensions. There are substantial increases in death benefits.

Dr. H. G. Tuttle, secretary of the pensions department, rose late in the afternoon session to try to clarify the arguments presented up to that point and explain in greater detail what the new pension plan envisaged.

"What I have heard here today is confusion twice confounded, he said. "Every speaker appears to be coming at the issue on a tangent all his own."

"Are you saying that you would be in favor of the new plan if you could be sure that you would get more?" he asked.

"No," went up the cry from the 375 lay and clerical delegates. "Are you saying that you're against the new plan?"

"No!" "Even I'm confused," he asked. But the delegates sidetracked further debate at the end of his 20-minute explanation and voted near-unanimous approval.

H-BOMB RESOLUTION

The council returned briefly to international affairs to approve an amendment to one of the six disarmament resolutions by Dr. A. E. Kerr, president of Dalhousie University.

It defined as the view of the church "that the use of the hydrogen bomb or any other thermonuclear weapon in war should be prohibited by international agreement."

"We believe," it added, "that the cause of world peace would be advanced by a general drastic reduction under effective safeguards of world armaments of all classes."

Pope Receives 150 Pilgrims

ROME (Reuters) — The Pope, who has been troubled by occasional fits of hiccups, received 150 pilgrims from the United States at his summer residence of Castel Gandolfo Thursday.

The 78-year-old pontiff also discussed important church matters with Monsignor Angelo Dell'Acqua, substitute for ordinary church affairs in the Vatican's secretariat of state.

Today the Pope will make a speech to geophysicists who attended an international congress in Rome. Next week he is expected to address delegates to the International Congress on Therapy.
