Pensioners Will Receive Cheques 2 Days Earlier

Since the first Old Age Security cheques were issued in the month of January, 1952, for persons over 70 years of age, the monthly cheques have been delivered on or after the last banking day of each month. Alfred S. Tait, Regional Director of Old Age Security, announces that a change in policy has now been effected whereby Old Age Security pensioners will receive their cheques on or after the third last banking day of each month. This is two days earlier than has been the custom in the past.

In this province Old Age Security cheques will be delivered to the pensioners on or after the 27th of the month. The gross payments to pensioners of this province out of Federal Government funds for the month of October amounts to \$239,214. Mr. Tait emphasizes at this time that the biggest problem in the Royal Office is that of establishing an applicant's date of birth or the date of his or her entry into two classes, Class A and Class B. An applicant's age may be established by a number of means: "The Class A type or items of Class B if a Class A item is not available. Birth records registered within five years of the birth or if registered after January 1, 1948. A baptism certificate is regarded as Class A if the baptism took place within five years of the birth and if both the date of birth and date of baptism are shown on the certificate. The certificate must also bear the seal of the church or should be an official church letter from the pastor signed by a responsible church officer. There are many documents which can be considered as Class A, Family Bibles, Family Records, Marriage Records, Insurance of Government Annuity Records, Passports, Naturalization Certificates, Border Crossings, Census and Census Certificates, Immigration Records, Military Service Records, Employment Records, Unemployment Records, Educational Records, Medical Documents, Pension or Superannuation Records, Unemployment Records, etc. Any of these records of the Class B type must of course show the date of birth or the age at a given time. It is preferable that the oldest Class B records be made available to the Regional factory proof of age cannot be obtained from the sources listed above. The chief of a notary public's office, or a notary public, may be used as a last resort, but evidence of a notary public in establishing an applicant's date of birth.

A prospective applicant for Old Age Security, if sixty - nine and one half years of age, should not delay forwarding a completed application form if he has no documents available at the time. The Royal Office will give assistance and direction possible will be given by the Regional Office to any applicant in order to ensure the prompt processing of his application.
