Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, May 8—Sterling and the French franc continue at about the same level as they have been in last few days. According to Dow Jones, gold currencies continue under pressure and there are rumors in London of an increase of the Dutch bank rate. Paris market was active and irregular but later improved. Radical papers in Paris are demanding that the present Gov. do something about the monetary situation or give control of the Govt. over to those who come into control June 1. Turning to the domestic side there are some favorable news. Commercial Investment Trust directors met yesterday which was sooner than expected, and declared a 20 per cent dividend payable June 1 to stockholders of record May 18. In addition the directors increased the quarterly cash dividend to 30 cents which cash dividend will be payable after the stock dividend is paid, so that the dividend developments are equivalent to 6.25 on the present stock against current cash dividend of \$3. NEW YORK, May 8—Detroit—Passenger cars and trucks production this week is estimated at 117,804 units against 117,150 last week. This is the 11th consecutive week of increasing output. General Motors output this week is estimated at 59,750 against 49,550 last week. Chrysler estimated at 25,595 and Ford 28,140 both virtually unchanged from last week. The service estimates that domestic and Canadian deliveries this month will total above 425,000 units against about 390,000 in April.

Dull Session On New York Stock Market

(By Frank MacMillan, Associated Press Financial Writer) NEW YORK, May 8—The stock market twiddled its thumbs today as buyers and sellers, except in scattered instances, refused to back up their opinions with action.

There was little change in domestic industrial recovery indicators, but French financial difficulties appeared to be more critical than ever and many traders were content to stand aside and wait to see which direction the parade was going.

It was the dulllest full session since July 3, last year, transfers totaling only 779,839 shares against 1,005,410 yesterday. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks eased .1 of a point at 58.6.

Canadian issues generally were fractionally firmer. McIntyre-Porcupine got up 7-8 while Canadian Pacific, Distillers-Seagram, Dome, Canadian Industrial Alcohol, Imp-Pete Tobacco and a few others were ahead smaller fractions.
