Opening lead—jack of spades. Dummy play is often a question of weighing one probability against another. When one line of play has a better chance of succeeding than another, the proper thing to do is follow the indicated percentage play.

South got to six diamonds on the bidding. South led the four of trumps, learning that the five notrump, spades and then hearts. But when north bid two clubs, indicating no kings, South settled for six diamonds.

The contractors' association are appealing to the Metropolitan Council against the award of a \$473,881 tender to firms owned by George Roberts and Fred Yonick, 38-year-old Frederickman who under the terms of the regular contract for \$181,000.

The council executive has the matter under consideration. The issue involves a contract for installing 36-inch pipes under concrete floors in a water pumping plant in downtown Toronto, plus other work in the area. It was granted on a joint bid by Dynamic Construction Company, controlled by Mr. Roberts, and Pressure Concrete Services Ltd., Mr. Roberts' firm.

The pair are Frederickman's graduates of University of New Brunswick, who landed in Toronto by separate paths about seven years ago and set up their firms separately. Since then they have teamed up on other jobs, though none as large as the Metro one.

**CLAIMS AWARD UNFAIR**  
Mr. Roberts' firm handles industrial-type contracts with high content of electrical or mechanical work, while Mr. Roberts' deals with specialized concrete installations.

Complaining about the award before the Metro executive committee was a government spokesman said Friday. Until a month ago Foot was Britain's spokesman in colonial affairs at the United Nations in New York. **CONTRACT BRIDGE**

West led a spade and South saw that even six was in danger. If West had led the jack of hearts and the problem was to find the right line of cutting off one of them.

Declarer realized he could not run the hearts through the clubs and ruff a fourth club dummy, and then play the ace and another heart trick.

This line of play would make the hand if it turned out that East had been dealt the singleton king or queen of hearts, the doubleton king or queen, or a hand of four-card heart holdings which would lead to the trump only one heart trick.

In all these cases, either the jack would become a trick or the defender would win the second heart lead would be forced to concede a ruff-discard.

That was one possible line of play—the elimination play. The other was to lead a club towards dummy and finesse the ace of hearts. If the contract was 5-0 chance—the contract would be made, since declarer would only lose one heart.

The choice was strictly a matter of percentage, a question of which method of play was more likely to succeed. Quite properly, he finessed the club. Luckily, the finesse succeeded and he made the slam.

Actually, the finesse offered the better chance and was markedly superior to the elimination play. It figures in a successful play, mathematically about twice as often as the elimination play.
