**Drive-in Eatery
Opens In Spring**

It was learned yesterday that the new drive-in restaurant now under construction at the intersection of the Malpeque Road and Belvedere Avenue will be ready for business in the spring.

One of a chain, A.W. Drive-In Canada Ltd., with branches in the Maritimes and United States, the new drive-in will feature A.W. products.

The manager will be J.R. Ed McKenna of Charlottetown.

The building is 27 ft wide and 33 ft in length. The front of the building will be paved and a "car boy aisle" provided. Car hostesses will take and serve orders.

The building will also harbor comfort stations for the convenience of patrons.

Best known of the A.W. products probably are the ice cold root beer and the "family burger", moon, pop and baby.

**Tire Squealing
Case Adjudged**

Entering a plea of not guilty to driving a motor vehicle so that it caused unnecessary noise (squealing tires) the case of George Allan McCoubrey, Cavendish, was adjudged until Feb. 14 for judgment by Magistrate James B. Johnston, Q.C. in Queens County magistrate's court yesterday.

Mr. McCoubrey acting in his own defence, called Kenneth Cousins, Rose Valley, as his witness.

In suggesting an adjournment, Magistrate Johnston said "I'll have to examine the evidence in this case; there seems to be a conflict here."

Allison Kenneth MacLeod, Hartsville, charged with knowingly permitting chemical substances to enter into water frequented by fish, had his case adjourned to Feb. 10 for plea.

**Ice In Gulf
Building Up**

The last ice map issued by the Halifax office of the department of transport on Jan. 19, and received by the provincial government shows that winter ice appears to be filling the Gulf of St. Lawrence faster than in previous years.

The map shows heavy ice along the western boundaries of the gulf, which extends southward from Anticosti Island through the Magdalen Islands to Cape Breton.

An ice chart, prepared from aircraft observations a few days earlier, showed much less ice in the Gulf.

UNOFFICIAL FIGURE

There were unofficial indications yesterday that the Gulf is now nine-tenths filled with winter ice.

Ice charts show winter ice filling the St. Lawrence River mouth, and ice entering the Gulf through the Strait of Belle Isle at the northern part of Newfoundland.

There have been reports of large quantities of "blue ice," or fresh water ice in the Gulf. Some observers say that this ice is in the Gulf as a result of the St. Lawrence River being kept partly open. The opening of the river allows fresh water ice to enter the Gulf from Quebec and Gaspe rivers.
