

**Planks Listed
In SC Platform
For Campaign**

TORONTO (CP) — Following are the 10 planks in the Social Credit Party campaign platform announced by Robert Thompson.

1. Responsible government — positive, responsible representation in a Parliament that will concern itself primarily with national and international affairs.
- 2.2 National interests — placing the country's interests above party considerations, including respect for the voters' choice of the makeup of parliament.
3. Policies and principles — preserving the democratic structure by opposition centralization and the drift to socialism. Increased efficiency of government services by eliminating waste, red tape and duplication.
4. Federal-provincial co-operation — the federal Parliament to work with provincial governments in a spirit of co-operation to expand the growth and economy of the provinces.
5. Financial reforms — major financial reforms will be advocated, giving the Bank of Canada power to provide public capital, thus reducing interest charges and releasing private capital to expand resource development.
6. Health services — support an adequate health care program on an individual voluntary basis, ensuring this service will be available to every individual and to include mental health and tuberculosis care in the hospital coverage.
7. Education and training program — support greater federal financial contributions to the provinces for universities and vocational training.
8. Development of natural resources — encourage competitive free enterprise initiative and maximum Canadian investment in the development and processing of Canada resources by reducing or eliminating those forms of taxation which retard or penalize development.
9. Agriculture and markets — vigorous promotion of export markets for agricultural production, including a two-price system for wheat, providing parity price for domestic consumption and negotiated prices for surplus.
10. Labor — the establishment of adequate fact-finding and mediation facilities to aid in resolving labor disputes.

**Corrections
Association
Has Proposal**

OTTAWA (CP) — A 40-member committee of the Canadian Corrections Association has recommended that permanent legal aid counselling services be established by all provincial governments.

The committee's report, now being studied in draft form by provincial legal and corrections associations, welfare agencies and human rights groups across the country, recommends procedures to ensure legal aid for accused persons unable to pay lawyers' fees.

It is to form the basis for a formal brief on legal aid which the corrections association (a division of the Canadian Welfare Council) will present to the federal justice minister and provincial attorneys-general within the next two months.

The report was issued to the various provincial agencies for study by the executive secretary of the corrections association, W. T. McGrath of Ottawa.

USE PUBLIC FUNDS
It says legal fees in counsel provided through legal aid and expenses related to cases should be paid from public funds, not provided on a voluntary basis.

Provincial bar associations should continue to play their major role in providing legal aid, but the report says it is impracticable to use volunteer legal aid for all counselling services.

"One of the difficulties involved in legal aid is to reach all individuals accused of a criminal offence well before their appearance in court, to ensure that each is aware of his legal rights and of the availability of counsel through legal aid if he cannot afford legal fees."

"This means that someone must be constantly available to our courts, someone who knows which individuals are accused and who knows police and court routines."

The committee's report says such a person, who would be known as a legal aid solicitor, could deal with the minor legal problems of those unable to pay for lawyers' services, and could serve as a liaison with the legal aid committee of the local bar association.
