**PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.**

**Much Important Legislation Kept Back.**

**Uncertainty as to Prorogation—Sir Charles off for England**

OTTAWA, June 14.—There is great uncertainty about the time of prorogation. While a sort of understanding exists that Saturday will be the last day of the session, the situation is complicated by the fact that three important measures, viz., the Crow's Nest Line, the Montreal Railway Extension and the Fast Steamship Contract have not yet been introduced. The main estimates are not yet through. The supplementary estimates for the current year were brought down but are not yet touched, and the supplementary estimates for the coming year are not yet brought down. The tariff is not yet through committee. However Sir Charles Tupper has taken passage for England and both he and Foster have been disposed to close up work this week if it can be done without allowing important legislation to pass without consideration and proper criticism. In no session in the history of Canada has important government legislation been held back as it has been this year. There is a strong kick in the liberal party over the Drummond and Grand Trunk deal. Mr. Cameron, of Huron, Mr. Lester and others, all strong party men, say openly that they will not support it. The Fast Steamship Line matter is the first order of the day. There will be no serious opposition to this contract from the Liberal-Conservative side.

**THE SULTAN HAS APPEALED.**

**It is Hard to Understand the Situation.**

**Turkish Officials Snap Their Fingers at the Powers.**

LONDON, June 14.—The Times correspondent at Constantinople says that the Sultan has appealed to the emperors Nicholas and William to support his claim to annex Thessaly to the Ottoman empire. This proceeding has displeased the ambassadors of the other powers who are expected to mark their displeasure by refusing to negotiate the other points in Turkey's demand until the evacuation demanded is settled.

LONDON, June 14.—A Salonica despatch published here says Europe scarcely seems to understand the position of affairs even now. It is this: There are 250,000 Ottoman troops in Thessaly at the present moment and 300,000 more in Macedonia ready to join and the Sultan wants to know which power or what combination of powers is going to undertake the job of turning him and his soldiers out. Turkish civil and military officials of the highest rank are continually passing to and from Constantinople and all snap their fingers at the powers and say rude things of the ambassadors. There is not one of them who does not laugh to scorn the idea of any combination of the powers against Turkey.

**PRESIDENT FAURE'S ESCAPE**

PARIS, June 14.—An attempt was made yesterday to assassinate M. Felix Faure, President of the French Republic, while he was en route to witness the Grand Prix. While M. Faure's carriage was passing near Lacasiade restaurant, in the Bois de Boulogne, a bomb of half an inch, charged with gunpowder and swan shot, exploded. No one was injured by the explosion. A man in the crowd, suspected as the prime mover, was arrested. He is thought to be insane.

**COLLEGIATE SCHOOL, WINDSOR, N. S.**

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Governor's of King's College, held on the 10th inst., the affairs of the Collegiate School engaged considerable attention. Testimonials of candidates for the position of head master were read, showing that there will be no difficulty in obtaining a most efficient man for the post, one of wide and successful experience in teaching and school management.

The appointment will be made by the Bishop of Nova Scotia early in July, after a personal interview with selected candidates.

Substantial reductions in several of the existing charges were agreed to, and it was also decided that those parents who wish to do so may, by agreement, pay all school fees in one fixed sum each term, and thus avoid the necessity of the continual consideration of a number of petty charges for "extras" etc.

A prospectus of the school will be issued as soon as the appointment of a head master shall have been made, copies of which may be obtained from the President of the College, who will also be rector of the school.

At the same meeting the faculty of the college were authorized to accept certificates from the head masters of such schools as they may approve, in lieu of the matriculation examination.
