I mean cold, because it is the freezing and thawing that kills tender plants in the garden. It is comforting to see all the green, green plants of forget-me-not ready to cover the ground with the bluest of flowers as soon as the spring has come. The ground under the beech trees in the little wood has hundreds of these plants to be a groundcover for the daffodils planted there. This spot is one of my favorite places in the garden and seats are there for moments of enjoyment. Some of my garden visitors share this joy with me and so we become friends. Consider the seasons, the joy of spring, the splendour of the summer, the sunset colours of the autumn, the delicate and graceful bareness of winter trees, the beauty of snow,

the beauty of light upon water, what the old Greek called the unnumbered smiling of the sea. In the feeling for this beauty, if we have it, we possess a pearl of great price. . . .

This week we shall continue our study of the beautiful book on the Royal Gardens and the gardens of Windsor Castle, these gardens are so rich and varied that they rival the best of the botanical gardens. There are, moreover, gardens to suit every taste, ranging from the formal garden on the east terrace with its central fountain, rows of great statues and formal geometric beds to the informal mediaeval atmosphere of the Round Tower Garden, developed in the moat and on the very foundations of the Tower, or the natural setting of the Savill Gardens with their ponds and streams planted with primulas, lilies, irises, bog plants and all the other delightful woodland plants which abound. In all these His Majesty King George the Sixth showed great interest, but in the gardens at The Royal Lodge his own personal taste and knowledge of design were best exemplified. There is no answer to the question: "When is the best time to see the gardens at Windsor?" So much depends on the particular flowers which one likes. Certainly the Savill Gardens should be seen when the daffodils are in bloom by the tens of thousands and the flowering cherries, magnolias and camellias vie with all the other wonderful flowering shrubs and trees of spring. Later there are the Valley Gardens brilliant with rhododendrons and the Punch Bowl ablaze with Kurume azaleas. The formal beds of the East Terrace are bright with bloom in the summer months, and the Savill Gardens have good herbaceous borders throughout the summer and autumn. One of the loveliest times in the Great Park and the Savill Gardens particularly is October, when the autumn colour starts and the berries and fruits, too numerous to be devoured by the birds, hang heavy on the trees and shrubs. By gracious permission of Her Majesty the Queen the Royal Mausoleum and its lovely surroundings in the Home Park are open every year on Whit Mondays.

From the horticulturist's point of view, the gardens at Windsor with their great variety of plants and trees and extensive landscaping are the most interesting of the Royal Gardens. There are 50 beautiful illustrations of the Tower and the foundations of the Tower and the simple Georgian facade with sweeping lawns and fine trees as seen from across the curving lake with a large clump of sweetly scented water-hawthorn. Weeping willows add to the charm of the lake and the stone bridge. A white marble Indian Temple adds interest to the trees shaded lawn in the Home

Park with evergreen trees and flowering cherries. Other lovely illustrations show the circular mausoleum where Victoria, Duchess of Kent, mother of Queen Victoria, is buried, with its ring of columns and rich sculptural detail effectively situated above the winding stretch of water. Fort Belvedere is seen through a grove of giant cedars. Here, the Duke of Windsor, then the Prince of Wales, started a collection of rhododendrons and restored the gardens. One illustration shows the Obelisk commemorating the martial exploits of the Duke of Cumberland stands at the top of a wooded rise in the Great Park. In the foreground is a stone bridge from which there is a lovely vista to the left into the Savill Gardens. . . . The Royal Lodge has a profusion of all the lovely flowers associated with an old-fashioned mixed border, lupines, irises, pyrethrum peonies, shrub roses, mignonette and lavender. Fragrance and colour and abundance are the keynote in the sunken garden with cedars as a background. Windsor Castle dominates the Long Walk. The recently planted double avenue of planes and horse-chestnuts flanks the central avenue which falls away from the gate to the south. The plan and siting of Windsor Castle show up boldly from the air. In the foreground is the formal parterre garden and the arcade of the orangery. Beyond, mediaeval splendour, rises the battlements, towers and fortified walls of England's most historic castle, against the backdrop of the river Thames and the 15th century College Chapel of Eton.
