Mercantile agency reports continue to speak well of the improving position and prospects of trade in Canada.

Hon. Mr. McLean, Commissioner of Public Works, is very busy in the District of Prince County offering new roads and high prices for rights of way.

Her Majesty has been pleased to confer upon Lord Rosebery the Order of the Thistle, one of the highest honors of the kind that it is in her power to bestow.

Few, if any, of the more prominent members of Lord Rosebery's Cabinet seem to have resigned office with feelings of regret.

The McCartyites have captured Cork in the bye-election. Out of 1,436 women who have been students in English colleges for women at Newham, Somerville, Holloway and Girton, only 208 are reported as having married, while 600 are engaged in teaching.

The Cologne Gazette urges the powers party to the Triple alliance to protest against the Turkish administration in Armenia, and to insist that the reforms demanded for Armenia be also applied to Macedonia.

The Ottawa street railway company is a money making concern. Its receipts last year were \$193,991, of which \$71,655 was profit.

A despatch from Rome says that the Pope has invited Cardinal Gibbons to visit and to reside in Rome and take part in the politics of the Vatican. It is added that Cardinal Gibbons has refused the offer of His Holiness.

Of the 103 cathedrals of the United Kingdom 43 are Roman Catholic, 36 Church of England, 12 Church of Ireland, and 7 Church of Scotland. The oldest cathedral in England is believed to be that of Winchester.

In the course of the sittings of the International Railway Congress, which is now in session in London, England, with about 500 delegates present, Sir Charles Tupper will read a paper on the development of railways in Canada, and trace their influence upon the country's economic progress especially in the Province west of Lake Superior.

PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

P. E. Island Branch Railway.

OTTAWA, July 4. Senator Prowse brought up the question of branch railways in P. E. Island and strongly urged that the Government should construct them.

The branch railway lines which it was sought to have built amounted in all to only 165 miles, and would cost in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000. They were all short and were intended as feeders to the main trunk line in connecting coast towns with the railway.

Referring to the action of Davies with regard to these proposed branches, he said that the Leader of the Liberal party in the Maritime Provinces hated the Conservative party more than he loved his country. It had been charged that these appeals for railway extension were being made to influence voters at the coming election.

Senator Prowse would give a direct answer in reference to the matter. Senator McDonald was also strongly in favor of the proposed railway extension in the Island and pointed out the immense advantage the branch lines would be to the people and the effect they would have in increasing the earnings of the main line.

Sir McKenzie Bowell thought the Island was entitled to branch railways on account of its being isolated from the rest of the Dominion, and called attention to a recent statement of the Minister of Railways to the same effect. All that he could promise was that when next the matter of assisting railways came up for attention by the Government, just as would be done the Island as well as other Provinces in common.

Hon. Mr. Haggart, replying to Mr. Perry, said that preparations for continuing the bridge in the Straits of Northumberland were in progress, and would be resumed as soon as the weather permitted.
