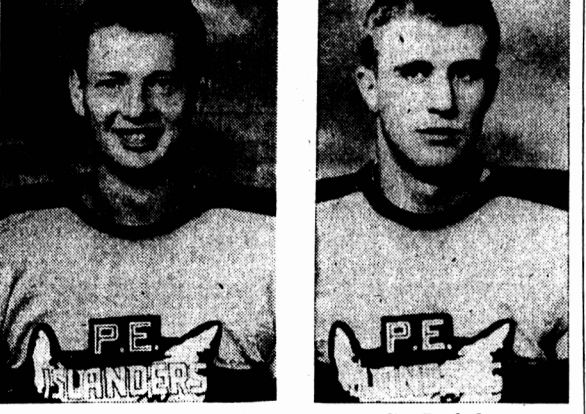

## Eighth Straight Win Gives 21-Point Lead To Charlottetown Team

A high-flying band of Islanders hockeyists chalked up their eighth straight victory over Forum ice last night when they handed Moncton Hawks the worst drubbing in Maritime Senior Hockey League play this year by burying them under a 13-2 landslide defeat.

With every man on the team, except defenceman Jack "Spy" Ready and goalie Hal Gordon, garnering at least one scoring point, the Lamoureux-coached Islanders virtually mopped up the ice with the Moncton Club and came up with such flashing demonstrations of passing attacks and power plays that had the Hub City hockeyists in a quagmire and fans dizzy watching it.

The win puts the local squad on top of the league leadership by a margin of 21 points over second-place Halifax Saint Mary's, who lost a 4-3 verdict to Saint John Beavers at the Nova Scotia capital last night.

Filling the net with pucks behind an overworked Moncton goalie Les Colvin, the Islanders pounded home five goals in the opening frame without a reply, added two more and allowed one against them in the sandwich session, and came back even stronger in the closing session to dent the twines six more times while Moncton garnered one. Two of Islanders first period goals came while they were playing a man short, defenceman Phil Vitale serving two minors together, one for holding and the other for roughing.

Playing without the services of all three of their centremen, Wes "Bucko" Trainor, Frank Bathgate and Hub Beaudry, the Islanders nevertheless skated the Hawks in circles and practically scored at will against a belated effort by Moncton to try and stem the tide.

With Bruno "Red" Favero centering between Walter Pawlyshyn on left wing and defenceman Larry Travis on right wing position, Pawlyshyn and Travis both came up with the hat trick on goals, while Favero collected four assists, Pawlyshyn three and Travis one. Taking Bathgate's place between the two Horeck Brothers as pivot man, Mac Beaton picked up two goals and three assists, Danny Horeck two goals and one assist while Johnny Vitale and Marcel Clements, Vitale also assisting on defenceman Johnny Morrow also came up with a top-notch performance with four assists, while George McLagan set up two more.

Leading what Moncton attack there was, Fred Denny, Rod McKenzie and Lou Milani were the big guns, Denny potting their opening counter on assists from McKenzie and Milani, while McKenzie got their closing counter on assists from Milani and Gus Gallepeau. Both counters came in the closing seconds of the second and third periods. Denny got h's at 19:43 of the middle session, while McKenzie dented the twines at 19:09 of the final frame. The latter was a nice effort on a three-way attack from the opposing blue-line in.

The two prettiest plays on Islanders goals during the night were by Mac Beaton and Phil Vitale. Beaton got his at 4:25 of the second period when a relay pass by McLagan and Morrow sent him on a breakaway from centre ice, Beaton firing home a hard backhand shot that beat Colvin cleanly. Vitale's was from a smart three-way passing play with Favero and Travis at 3:36 of the final session. Travis started the play from a passout from the corner to Vitale at the Moncton blue-line and after sidestepping two Moncton players, slipped it over to Favero along the left boards, and while working his way in to the front of Colvin, took the puck on a return pass from Favero to slam it home with a hard shot.

The bulk of the other Islanders goals were from well-organized and tricky passing attacks inside the Moncton blue-line that had Hawks players practically tripping over themselves in a futile effort to break them up.
