Our agenda includes Approval of Constitution Nomination and Election of offices Any other business Party.

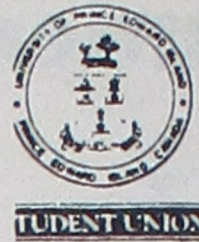
