## Boisterous Meeting Hears Diefenbaker At Sydney

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Diefenbaker flew home early Sunday after a boisterous Saturday night election rally in the industrial centre of Sydney on the north coast of Nova Scotia.

The Sydney meeting saw some lively heckling but there were no real incidents—although a few men were arrested by police officers for allegedly hurling eggs in passing cars in a Progressive Conservative campaign.

The night meeting brought out more than 2,000 persons to Sydney Academy to hear Mr. Diefenbaker review his party's plans for the Atlantic provinces, including creation of a new Atlantic development board to study projects designed to develop and expand economic activity in the area.

When Mr. Diefenbaker announced his plan for the development board in Saint John, N.B., May 15, he said he hoped it would look into proposals for the Chignecto Canal across the narrow isthmus linking Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and for power development of the Bay of Fundy tides.

Mr. Diefenbaker referred to his speech in the editorial support for his government in the June issue of the Atlantic Advocate, a Maritime magazine published in Fredericton, N.B. He read whole passages from the editorial and gained heavy cheers—as well as a few boos—when he said the Atlantic Advocate said:

"The Diefenbaker government has given to the Atlantic provinces more by far than any government of any party at any time."  
The prime minister said his government plans to expand opportunities to the Atlantic area through higher adjustment grants to the provinces, special incentives to secondary industry, a national highway program and other projects.  
He also announced that he will meet in June—after the election—with representatives of the United Mine Workers of America (Ind.), the Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation and the provincial government on the threatened closure Aug. 1 of a colliery at New Waterford, N.S.  
About 1,000 workers are employed in the mine.

## Douglas Has 3 Themes In Speech At Edmonton

EDMONTON (CP)—T. C. Douglas reached the halfway point in his harrowing stretch drive to his election campaign here Saturday night, hitting hard on three main issues—prices, medical care and nuclear arms.

The New Democratic Party leader told a crowd of 3,100 persons in the Jubilee Auditorium that the latest round of consumer price increases is due mainly to price-fixing by greedy corporations.  
He won his biggest applause when he said the NDP pledge to set up national medical care legislation with the federal government paying 90 per cent of the costs for any province which set up a medical care scheme.  
Mr. Douglas and his aides were related with the burst "Tommy the Diefenbaker" and "who needs the boos? We've got Douglas." A small boy carried a sign, "No more Diefenbakers."
