

AN OUTSIDE VIEW OF THE NEW STORE

Ray's Grocery Market Opens In Georgetown

Keeping pace with progress and development in Georgetown, Raymond Lavandier's new food market opens for business this week. Known as Ray's Lucky Dollar Food Market the new store is modern in every respect and is the newest addition to Georgetown's business establishments.

Mr. Lavandier has been in the grocery business since 1953 and has been a member of the Lucky Dollar chain of food stores since 1959.

Several months ago Mr. Lavandier moved his former store from the site where he had carried on business since 1953 and on the same location on the corner of Victoria and Grafton Streets, the new food market was built. The new building measures 60 feet by 30 feet and is of wood construction. The exterior is painted white with black asphalt shingle roof. It is erected on a concrete block foundation. The front of the store is on Victoria Street and has two large plate glass windows, each measuring 6 feet by 8 feet. The customer entrance is located in

the south-west corner of the building and features an entrance and exit door, with each door having a 5 feet by 2 feet glass panel. Running across the front of the outside of the store is a 30 foot long, 2 feet high neon sign, spelling out the words "Ray's Lucky Dollar Food Market".

The interior of the new store is painted in white. Attractive tile covers the floor and the ceiling is finished in white tile. Three rows of fluorescent lighting run the length of the store. Wall shelving and two gondolas, which run the length of the store from west to east provide ample space for merchandise display. The gondolas are four shelves in height. A check-out counter is situated near the customer entrance and exit. The north wall of the store is lined with the meat display case; packaged meat display containers; counters for frozen foods; dairy products and fruit and vegetable display counters and bins. Situated at the east end of the building is a room to be utilized for the cutting and

packaging of meat; an office area; and a warehouse area, with a large double-door entrance. The furnace room is also located in this area and the store is heated by an automatic - oil warm - air furnace, with 14 warm-air ducts.

The store will carry a full line of groceries; meats; dairy pro-

ducts; frozen foods; vegetables; fruits and a complete line of housewares.

The business will be operated on the complete self-service system; with shopping carts and baskets for customer convenience.

Complete and attractive refrigeration facilities and display cases are provided for all merchandise requiring refrigeration.

The store will be under the personal management of Mr. Lavandier and is one of Lucky Dollar chain of food markets.

Money Market Said Difficult

TORONTO (CP)—Traders Finance Corp. Ltd., says 1965 was an unusually difficult year because of the collapse of Atlantic Acceptance Corp. which tightened money and made it more costly to borrow.

In the company's annual report released Tuesday, President R. M. Willmott said the cost of borrowed funds increased steadily during the last half of the year and fourth quarter results were not as good as the first three quarters.

However, Traders managed to make a profit for the year of \$6,011,917, the highest in the company's history, compared with \$5,520,400 in 1964. The company will announce a major reorganization in the next month or two, Mr. Willmott said.

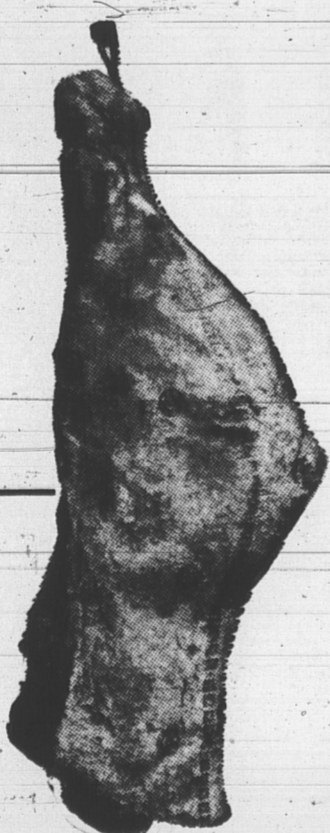
