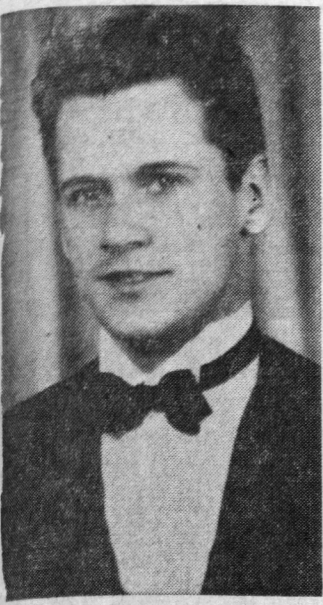


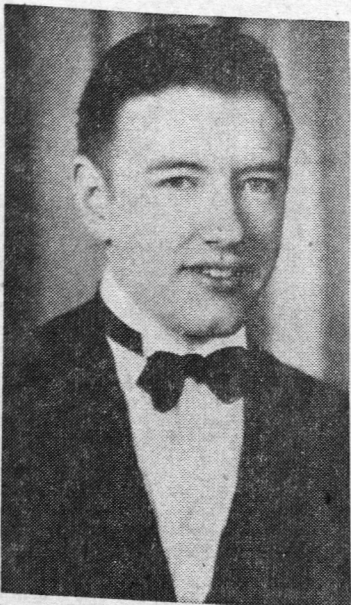
IN P.W.C. GRADUATING CLASS



FRANK BURKE

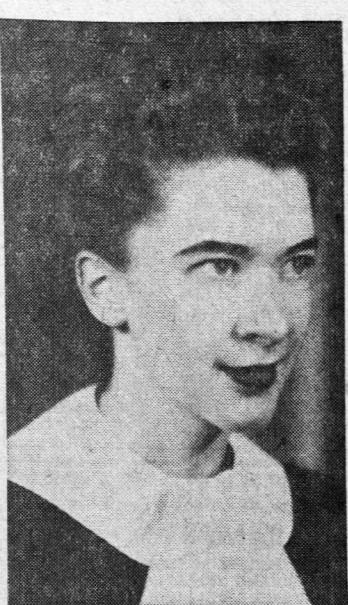
