Racial Violence Poses Real Threat Across U.S.

Caught in the turmoil of a summer of bitter racial discord, Americans find it difficult at times to assess the dimensions of the crisis, to know what has been accomplished and what lies ahead.

NEW YORK (AP)—The U.S. Negro drive for full equality has reached the dimensions of a national convulsion. It wracks the whole United States, not just the South.

It touches schools and employment, a seat at a lunch counter and a home in a better neighborhood, the right to vote and the right to worship in any church, the right to sit in any public park and to read a book in any public library.

It touches the rights of Negroes as an American citizen and as a taxpayer, as a worker, as a consumer, as a voter, as a parent, as a neighbor, as a citizen.

Violence begets violence and the possibility of a white reaction has been noted by many observers. "That's the danger," said Hodding Carter, editor of the Greenville, Miss., Delta-Democrat, "all hell will break loose."

During the demonstrations in Birmingham, Ala., last spring, a white taxi driver said to me "if they kill any white people, I'll quit my profession. I'll just start killing."

What are the positive sides? The principal ones would seem to be these: 1. To a greater degree than ever before, the problem is out in the open. More people are aware of the intricacies and the injustices.

By photographs of dogs leaping toward Negroes, rioting around "freedom rides" at a bus station, Nor, of course, was Birmingham the only city to use dogs.

At Oxford, Miss., two men died and scores were injured when a race riot broke out. The riot was the first since the 1950s.

Long before these incidents, however, the jubilation of 1954 when the Supreme Court decision on school desegregation was announced, Negroes were being hit by a white boycott.

The Southern Christian Leadership Conference, headed by Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., boycotted segregated bus lines in Montgomery, Ala., in 1955 and 1956 and won.

The Negroes began concentrating their efforts in another line of action, the Student Non-Violent Co-ordinating Committee, has been active in this work.

The Justice department has assisted. Since 1961, it has filed 29 suits against officials for refusing to register qualified Negroes. About half these suits have been won.

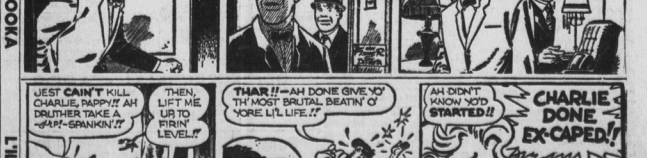
