WASHINGTON (AP) — The state department disclosed Monday that the United States is negotiating for a submarine test centre in The Bahamas. Birmingham Mayor Sworn In But Situation Is Unsettled

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Albert Boutwell was inaugurated mayor of this racially troubled city Monday, but the courts apparently will have to determine the future of the city's administration. Boutwell, 58-year-old former lieutenant-governor of Alabama, was sworn in at ceremonies before a small crowd on the steps of the city hall. The crowd included a sprinkling of Negroes. Later, several Negroes were arrested in lunch counter sit-ins, but racial demonstrations which had been promised at Boutwell's inauguration did not develop. Boutwell and the new nine-man city council has run into conflict with the old three-man city commission, which has refused to relinquish its offices.

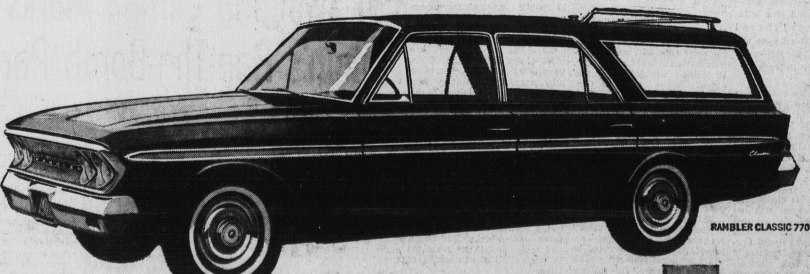
