In pursuance of An Act of the Legislature of the Province of Prince Edward Island made and passed in the Twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI, Chapter 43, entitled "An Act to consolidate and Amend the several Acts incorporating the City of Charlottetown", and all Acts in amendment thereof or in addition thereto.

I do hereby give PUBLIC NOTICE that a By-Election for two persons to serve on the City Council as Councillors for Ward Six of the City of Charlottetown

on Wednesday The Twenty-First Day of May, 1958
at The Fire Hall On Eden Street in Said Ward Six

at which place the Poll will be opened at Nine o'clock in the forenoon and continue open until Six o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

At the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, until the hour of Four o'clock in the afternoon of the same day,

And I further GIVE NOTICE that on the same date and time and as required by Act 7 Elizabeth II, Chapter 38

A GENERAL PLEBISCITE

will be held throughout the City at which all persons entitled to vote in the several wards of the City for Mayor and Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply will be asked to vote at the Polling places below, on the following question:—

Do you favor the proposal that the control and administration of the Water and Sewerage system of Charlottetown be immediately taken over by the City Council from the present Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply, and that henceforth no such Commissioners shall be elected. (Please answer by marking a cross opposite "Yes" or "No" on the ballot.)

POLLING DISTRICTS

WARD ONE

EAST OF GREAT GEORGE STREET—The First Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number One, in the City of Charlottetown, situate East of Great George Street, and the Poll shall be held at or near the residence of William McGee, being No. 27 Weymouth Street.

WEST OF GREAT GEORGE STREET—The Second Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number One, in the City of Charlottetown, situate West of Great George Street, and the Poll shall be held at or near the Labourers' Protective Union Hall, 48 Water Street.

WARD TWO

EAST OF GREAT GEORGE STREET—The Third Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number Two, in the City of Charlottetown, situate East of Great George Street, and the Poll shall be held at Wilfred Doucette's residence, No. 70 Prince Street.

WEST OF GREAT GEORGE STREET—The Fourth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number Two, in the City of Charlottetown, situate West of Great George Street, and the Poll shall be held at the shop of W. L. McKenna & Co., being No. 125 Sydney Street.

WARD THREE

The Fifth Polling Division shall comprise Ward Number Three, in the City of Charlottetown, and the Poll shall be held at or near the Market House.

WARD FOUR EAST

EAST OF HILLSBOROUGH STREET—The Sixth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number Four, in the City of Charlottetown, situate East of Hillsborough Street, and the Poll shall be held at or near the residence of Mr. George Cobb, being No. 228 Fitzroy Street.

WARD FOUR CENTRAL

The Seventh Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number Four, situate West of Hillsborough Street and East of Great George Street, and the Poll shall be held at or near the Maritime Compact Sales, being No. 176 on the South side of Kent Street.

WARD FOUR WEST

WEST OF GREAT GEORGE STREET—The Eighth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number Four, in the said City, situate West of Great George Street, and the Poll shall be held at the City Building.

WARD FIVE EAST

EAST OF HILLSBOROUGH STREET—The Ninth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Number Five, in Charlottetown, East of Hillsborough Street, and a line in continuation thereof to the division line between Charlottetown Common and Royalty, and the Polls (A to H) (I to Z) shall be held at the Sports Arena, being No. 235 Fitzroy Street.

WARD FIVE EAST CENTRAL

The Tenth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Five, in Charlottetown, East of Great George Street and the Malpeque Road and West of Hillsborough Street and a line in continuation thereof to the division line between Charlottetown Common and Royalty, and the Poll shall be held at or near the Red Indian Service Station, corner Fitzroy and Great George Streets.

WARD FIVE WEST CENTRAL

WEST OF GREAT GEORGE STREET AND EAST OF QUEEN STREET—The Eleventh Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Five, in Charlottetown, West of Great George Street and Malpeque Road and East of Queen Street, and the Poll shall be held at or near the store of S. G. Cameron, being No. 135 Euston Street.

WARD 5 WEST A

The Twelfth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Five, North side of Fitzroy Street from Queen to the East Side of Government Pond, thence northwardly to include South side of Euston Street, East side of Spring Street, South side of Victoria Street and East side of Spring Park Road to the former City Limits, thence the Western side of Upper Queen Street and Queen Street to point of commencement at Fitzroy Street, and the poll shall be at Euston Street Service Station, corner of Queen and Euston Streets.

WARD 5 WEST B

The Thirteenth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of Ward Five, West side of West Street, including Government House and Land at Victoria Park, and that portion which shall include Brighton Road, Euston Street to the West side of Spring Street, North side of Victoria Street and West side of Spring Park Road to the former City Limits and the polls shall be at or near the Ambrose Street Groceteria, being No. 75 Ambrose Street. Polls A to K, and L to Z.

WARD SIX

The Fourteenth Polling Division shall comprise all that portion of the City north of Ward Five, and formerly known as the Village of Spring Park, and the Poll shall be held at the Fire Hall on Eden Street.
